ASSEMBLY CONCURRENT RESOLUTION—Directing the Legislative Commission to conduct an interim study of the Public Employees' Benefits Program.

WHEREAS, The Public Employees' Benefits Program provides various types of insurance coverage and other benefits for most of the active and retired state employees and for many other active and retired employees of local governmental entities; and

WHEREAS, Many retired employees depend on the Public Employees' Benefits Program for their primary or supplemental health coverage and have been disproportionately affected by increases in their premium rates and reductions in benefits; and

WHEREAS, With the changes in demographics in state employment, the proportion of retired employees participating in the Program is likely to increase significantly in the future; and

WHEREAS, During the immediately preceding legislative session, the Legislature granted large groups of participants the ability to leave the Program in certain circumstances; and

WHEREAS, The particular components of the package of benefits offered by the Program, such as the level of deductibles and copayments, can affect significantly the quantity and quality of benefits received by participants in the Program; and

WHEREAS, The Program has experienced significant turnover in its management staff recently; and

WHEREAS, The financial stability and actuarial soundness of the Program is of vital importance to its participants and the State of Nevada; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED BY THE ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, THE SENATE
CONCURRING, That the Legislative Commission is hereby directed to
appoint a committee of legislators to conduct an interim study of the Public
Employees' Benefits Program; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the study must include, without limitation:



- 1. An evaluation of the types of benefits offered by the Public Employees' Benefits Program, including, without limitation, pharmacy benefits;
 - An examination of the rate design of the Program;

- 2. 3. Consideration of issues relating to retired employees who participate in the Program;
