AN ACT relating to education; providing for the gubernatorial appointment of the superintendent of public instruction; specifying the date for expiration of the term of office of the incumbent superintendent of public instruction; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. NRS 385.150 is hereby amended to read as follows:

385.150 1. The **[state board] governor** shall appoint the superintendent of public instruction for a term of 3 years. The **[state board]** governor may remove the superintendent of public instruction from office for inefficiency, neglect of duty, malfeasance in office or for other just

- 2. A vacancy must be filled by the **state board** governor for the remainder of the unexpired term.
- 3. The superintendent of public instruction is in the unclassified service of the state.
- **Sec. 2.** NRS 385.170 is hereby amended to read as follows: 385.170 The superintendent *of public instruction* shall not pursue any other business or occupation or hold any other office of profit without the approval of the [state board of education.] governor.

 Sec. 3. 1. The term of office of the superintendent of public
- instruction who is incumbent on December 31, 2001, expires on that date.
- 2. Not later than January 1, 2002, the governor shall appoint a person to serve as the superintendent of public instruction pursuant to section 1 of this act whose term commences on January 1, 2002.
- **Sec. 4.** This act becomes effective on July 1, 2001.
