AN ACT relating to forfeitures; providing that ownership of an aircraft forfeited for the commission of a crime may be transferred to the Nevada Wing of the Civil Air Patrol; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. NRS 179.1175 is hereby amended to read as follows: 179.1175 1. After property has been seized, the agency which seized the property may:

(a) Place the property under seal;

- (b) Remove the property to a place designated by the agency for the storage of that type of property; or
- (c) Remove the property to an appropriate place for disposition in a manner authorized by the court.
 - 2. When a court declares property to be forfeited, the plaintiff may:
- (a) Retain it for official use;
- (b) In the case of an aircraft, transfer ownership of the aircraft to the Nevada Wing of the Civil Air Patrol;
- (c) Sell any of it which is neither required by law to be destroyed nor harmful to the public; or
- **[(e)]** (d) Remove it for disposition in accordance with the applicable provisions of NRS.
