AN ACT relating to the department of business and industry; establishing a bill of rights for persons whose financial or other business records are subject to examination by the commissioner of financial institutions; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Chapter 232 of NRS is hereby amended by adding thereto the provisions set forth as sections 2 to 8, inclusive, of this act.

Sec. 2. As used in sections 2 to 8, inclusive, of this act, unless the context otherwise requires, the words and terms defined in sections 3 and 4 of this act have the meanings ascribed to them in those sections.

Sec. 3. "Commissioner" means the commissioner of financial institutions.

Sec. 4. "Examination" includes any audit, investigation or other inspection of the financial or other business records of a person.

Sec. 5. Section 6 of this act may be cited as the Business Records Bill of Rights.

Sec. 6. The legislature hereby declares that, except as otherwise provided by specific statute, each person who is subject to regulation by the commissioner has the right:

1. To be treated by officers and employees of the commissioner with courtesy, fairness, uniformity, consistency and common sense.

2. To a prompt response from the commissioner to each communication from the person who is subject to regulation by the commissioner regarding the maintenance or examination of his financial or other business records.



3. To provide the minimum documentation and other information as may reasonably be required by the commissioner to carry out its duties.

- 4. To written explanations of the common errors, oversights and violations that persons who are subject to regulation by the commissioner experience with their financial and other business records and instructions on how to avoid such problems.
- 5. In any meeting with the commissioner regarding the financial or other business records of the person who is subject to regulation by the commissioner, including any examination, conference, interview or hearing:
- (a) To an explanation by an officer, agent or employee of the commissioner that describes the procedures to be followed and the rights of the person who is subject to regulation by the commissioner thereunder;
- (b) To self-representation or representation by anyone who is otherwise authorized by law to represent the person who is subject to regulation by the commissioner before the commissioner;
- (c) To make an audio recording using the equipment of, and at the expense of, the person who is subject to regulation by the commissioner; and
- (d) To receive a copy of any document or audio recording made by or in the possession of the commissioner regarding the financial or other business records of the person who is subject to regulation of the commissioner, upon payment of the actual cost to the commissioner of making the copy.
- 6. To a full explanation of the authority of the commissioner relating to the examination of his financial or other business records, including any procedures and notices for review and appeal that are required for the protection of the person who is subject to regulation by the commissioner. An explanation which meets the requirements of this subsection must be included with each notice to a person who is subject to regulation by the commissioner that such an examination will be conducted by the commissioner.
- 7. To simplified written instructions concerning the rights and responsibilities of the person who is subject to regulation by the commissioner regarding the maintenance and examination of his financial and other business records.
- 8. To be free from the examination of his financial or other business records by an officer, agent or employee of the commissioner for any purpose that is not directly related to a regulatory function of the commissioner.
- 9. To be free from harassment and intimidation by an officer, agent or employee of the commissioner for any reason.
- 10. To discuss any examination of his financial or other business records by the commissioner, and any matters relating to the examination, without restriction by the commissioner, with any person or governmental entity.
- 11. To have any laws and regulations adopted pursuant thereto relating to the maintenance or examination of the financial or other



business records of the person who is subject to regulation by the commissioner construed in favor of the person who is subject to regulation by the commissioner if those laws or regulations are of doubtful validity or effect, unless a specific provision of law is applicable. Sec. 7. 1. The commissioner shall adopt such regulations or

ordinances as are appropriate to carry out the provisions of the Business Records Bill of Rights.

The commissioner shall cause:

- (a) To be prepared in simple nontechnical terms a pamphlet setting forth the provisions of the Business Records Bill of Rights and a description of the applicable regulations or ordinances adopted pursuant to subsection 1.
 - (b) A copy of the pamphlet to be distributed:
- (1) To each person who is subject to regulation by the commissioner on record with the commissioner and to any other person upon request; and
- (2) With each notice to a person who is subject to regulation by the commissioner that the commissioner will conduct an examination of the financial or other business records of the person who is subject to regulation by the commissioner.
- Sec. 8. Except as otherwise provided by specific statute, the commissioner shall, within 30 days after he receives from a person whom he regulates a written request relating to the maintenance or examination of his financial or other business records, provide the person who is subject to regulation by the commissioner with a written response to that request.

- Sec. 9. NRS 232.505 is hereby amended to read as follows: 232.505 As used in NRS 232.505 to 232.840, inclusive, *and sections 2* to 8, inclusive, of this act, unless the context requires otherwise:
- 30 1. "Department" means the department of business and industry.
 - "Director" means the director of the department.
