SUMMARY—Establishes certain requirements for issuance of work permits to certain employees who work in gaming establishments by local governments. (BDR 20-158)

AN ACT relating to local governments; prohibiting certain local governments from denying the request of a person for a work permit to work as a nongaming employee under certain circumstances; prohibiting the televised broadcast of an appeal of the denial of a request for the issuance of a work permit to work as a nongaming employee; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Chapter 244 of NRS is hereby amended by adding thereto a new section to read as follows:

- 1. If a county requires a person to obtain a work permit to work as a nongaming employee, the request of a person for the issuance of a work permit must not be denied solely because:
- (a) The person has been arrested; or(b) The person has been convicted of a crime more than 7 years before the date the person applies for the work permit.
- 2. If a person appeals to the board of county commissioners the denial of a request for the issuance of a work permit to work as a nongaming employee, the appeal must not be broadcast to the public on television.

- (a) "Gaming" has the meaning ascribed to it in NRS 463.0153.(b) "Gaming employee" has the meaning ascribed to it in NRS 463.0157.
- (c) "Nongaming employee" means a person who works in an establishment where gaming is conducted and who is not a gaming employee.



- (d) "Work permit" means any card, certificate or permit issued by a county licensing authority, whether denominated as a work permit, registration card or otherwise, authorizing the holder to be employed as a nongaming employee.
- **Sec. 2.** Chapter 268 of NRS is hereby amended by adding thereto a new section to read as follows:
- 1. If a city requires a person to obtain a work permit to work as a nongaming employee, the request of a person for the issuance of a work permit must not be denied solely because:
 - (a) The person has been arrested; or
- (b) The person has been convicted of a crime more than 7 years before the date the person applies for the work permit.
- 2. If a person appeals to the city council or other governing body of the city the denial of a request for the issuance of a work permit to work as a nongaming employee, the appeal must not be broadcast to the public on television.
 - 3. As used in this section:

- (a) "Gaming" has the meaning ascribed to it in NRS 463.0153.
- (b) "Gaming employee" has the meaning ascribed to it in NRS 463.0157.
- (c) "Nongaming employee" means a person who works in an establishment where gaming is conducted and who is not a gaming employee.
- (d) "Work permit" means any card, certificate or permit issued by a city licensing authority, whether denominated as a work permit, registration card or otherwise, authorizing the holder to be employed as a nongaming employee.
- **Sec. 3.** Chapter 269 of NRS is hereby amended by adding thereto a new section to read as follows:
- 1. If a town board or board of county commissioners requires a person to obtain a work permit to work as a nongaming employee, the request of a person for the issuance of a work permit must not be denied solely because:
 - (a) The person has been arrested; or
- (b) The person has been convicted of a crime more than 7 years before the date the person applies for the work permit.
- 2. If a person appeals to the town board or board of county commissioners the denial of a request for the issuance of a work permit to work as a nongaming employee, the appeal must not be broadcast to the public on television.
 - 3. As used in this section:
 - (a) "Gaming" has the meaning ascribed to it in NRS 463.0153.
- (b) "Gaming employee" has the meaning ascribed to it in NRS 463.0157.
- (c) "Nongaming employee" means a person who works in an establishment where gaming is conducted and who is not a gaming employee.
