AN ACT relating to elections; requiring a person who holds an elected state or local office to resign that office before he becomes a candidate for a different elected state or local office or an elected federal office under certain circumstances; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Chapter 293 of NRS is hereby amended by adding thereto a new section to read as follows:

- 1. Except as otherwise provided in subsection 2:
- 4 (a) An elected state or local public officer; or

- (b) A person appointed to serve as a state or local public officer during a term to which another person was elected,
- may not become a candidate for a different elected state or local office or an elected federal office, unless he first resigns his current state or local office.
- 2. The provisions of subsection 1 do not apply to a public officer whose current term of state or local office will end within 3 months after the general election for a different public office for which he becomes a candidate.
- **Sec. 2.** Chapter 293C of NRS is hereby amended by adding thereto a new section to read as follows:
- 1. Except as otherwise provided in subsection 2:
- 17 (a) An elected state or local public officer; or



(b) A person appointed to serve as a state or local public officer during a term to which another person was elected, may not become a candidate for a different elected state or local office or an elected federal office, unless he first resigns his current state or local

- 2. The provisions of subsection 1 do not apply to a public officer whose current term of state or local office will end within 3 months after the general election for a different public office for which he becomes a 9 candidate.
