AN ACT relating to state employees; providing for the payment of retention bonuses to persons employed in the classified or unclassified service of this state; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN  
SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

- 1     **Section 1.** 1. Notwithstanding the provisions of any specific statute  
2     to the contrary, and except as otherwise provided in subsection 2, each  
3     person who is employed in the classified or unclassified service of this  
4     state on the effective date of this act is entitled to receive a retention bonus  
5     of \$20 for each full calendar month of continuous service during the period  
6     beginning on January 1, 1991, and ending on December 31, 2000.  
7     2. If an employee had an interruption in continuous service at any time  
8     during the period described in subsection 1, or at any time thereafter which  
9     is before the effective date of this act, no month served by the employee at  
10    any time before the interruption in continuous service may be counted in  
11    determining the amount of the employee's retention bonus pursuant to this  
12    section.  
13    3. As used in this section, "continuous service" means uninterrupted  
14    service as defined by the personnel commission pursuant to NRS 284.177.  
15    **Sec. 2.** The bonuses required by section 1 of this act must be paid as  
16    soon as practicable after the effective date of this act.  
17    **Sec. 3.** This act becomes effective upon passage and approval.
