SUMMARY—Revises provision concerning amount paid to Civil Air Patrol account.
(BDR 32-1157)

AN ACT relating to the Civil Air Patrol; increasing the maximum amount that may be paid to
the Civil Air Patrol account from the account for taxes on aviation fuel; and
providing other matters properly relating thereto.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN
SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

- 1 **Section 1.** NRS 365.565 is hereby amended to read as follows:
2 365.565 The tax derived from aviation fuel must be distributed
3 quarterly from the account for taxes on aviation fuel in the following
4 manner:
5 1. There must be transferred to the Civil Air Patrol account, hereby
6 created, from the account for taxes on aviation fuel, for the ensuing fiscal
7 year, a sum not to exceed ~~\$85,000~~ ***\$130,000*** or the total amount in the
8 account, whichever is less. The amount so transferred must be expended
9 for the support of ***the*** Nevada Wing ~~{27004}~~ of the Civil Air Patrol and is
10 in addition to and separate from any legislative appropriations made to the
11 Civil Air Patrol account for the support of that wing.
12 2. Money in the Civil Air Patrol account may be paid out only upon
13 claims certified by the wing commander and the wing finance officer and
14 approved by the state board of examiners, in the same manner as other
15 claims against the state are paid.
16 3. Money in the Civil Air Patrol account may be used only by the wing
17 to:
18 (a) Carry out its search, rescue and emergency operations;
19 (b) Maintain a headquarters; and



- 1 (c) Purchase, maintain and repair emergency and training equipment.
- 2 4. No money in the Civil Air Patrol account may be expended for:
- 3 (a) The purchase of any aircraft;
- 4 (b) Travel expenses;
- 5 (c) Training expenses; or
- 6 (d) Fuel for vehicles or aircraft used in an official mission of the United
- 7 States Air Force.
- 8 5. Any person who makes a claim against the Civil Air Patrol account
- 9 shall reimburse the account if payment for the claim is also received from
- 10 another source.
- 11 6. There must be remitted to the treasurer of each county such portion
- 12 of the remaining balance in the account for taxes on aviation fuel as is
- 13 proportional to the excise taxes remitted by dealers or users in his county.
- 14 **Sec. 2.** This act becomes effective on July 1, 2001.
