

SENATE BILL NO. 396—SENATOR MCGINNESS

MARCH 19, 2001

Referred to Committee on Transportation

SUMMARY—Makes various changes regarding traffic laws. (BDR 43-1219)

AN ACT relating to traffic laws; requiring the driver of a slow-moving vehicle to turn off the roadway in certain circumstances; prohibiting a person from driving a vehicle in an imprudent or careless manner; providing that a vehicle upon a highway of this state must display appropriate lighted lamps and illuminating devices in certain circumstances; authorizing the department of transportation or a local law enforcement agency to allow a person to drive or move certain vehicles or combinations of vehicles to and from the site of an emergency without a special permit under certain circumstances; requiring the department to integrate the consideration of turnouts for vehicles into plans, designs, construction and maintenance of highways in certain circumstances; providing penalties; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN
SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

- 1 **Section 1.** Chapter 484 of NRS is hereby amended by adding thereto
2 the provisions set forth as sections 2 and 3 of this act.
3 **Sec. 2. 1. *On a highway that has one lane for traveling in each***
4 ***direction, where passing is unsafe because of traffic traveling in the***
5 ***opposite direction or other conditions, the driver of a slow-moving***
6 ***vehicle, behind which five or more vehicles are formed in a line, shall***
7 ***turn off the roadway to allow the vehicles following behind to proceed:***
8 ***(a) At the nearest place designated as a turnout by signs erected by the***
9 ***public authority having jurisdiction over the highway; or***
10 ***(b) Wherever sufficient area for a safe turnout exists and the driver***
11 ***may safely turn off the highway into that turnout.***
12 **2. A person who violates subsection 1 is guilty of a misdemeanor.**
13 **3. As used in this section, “slow-moving vehicle” means a vehicle**
14 ***that is traveling at a rate of speed which is less than the posted speed***
15 ***limit for the highway or portion of the highway upon which the vehicle is***
16 ***traveling.***



1 **Sec. 3. 1. A person shall not drive a vehicle:**

2 **(a) In an imprudent manner, including, without limitation, in a**
3 **manner which indicates that he is not in complete control of his vehicle**
4 **because his full time and attention are not devoted to the driving of the**
5 **vehicle; or**

6 **(b) In a careless or negligent manner.**

7 **2. A person who violates subsection 1 is guilty of a misdemeanor.**

8 **Sec. 4.** NRS 484.373 is hereby amended to read as follows:

9 484.373 1. If any driver drives a motor vehicle at a speed so slow as
10 to impede the forward movement of traffic proceeding immediately behind
11 him, the driver shall:

12 (a) If the highway has one lane for traveling in each direction and the
13 width of the paved portion permits, drive to the extreme right side of the
14 highway ~~and~~ **and, if applicable, comply with the provisions of section 2 of**
15 **this act;**

16 (b) If the highway has two or more clearly marked lanes for traffic
17 traveling in his direction, drive in the extreme right-hand lane except when
18 necessary to pass other slowly moving vehicles; or

19 (c) If the highway is a controlled-access highway, use alternate routes
20 whenever possible.

21 2. A person shall not bring a vehicle to a complete stop upon a
22 roadway so as to impede or block the normal and reasonable movement of
23 traffic unless the stop is necessary for safe operation or in compliance with
24 law.

25 **Sec. 5.** NRS 484.545 is hereby amended to read as follows:

26 484.545 1. Every vehicle upon a highway of this state ~~at any time~~
27 ~~from a half hour after sunset to a half hour before sunrise and at any other~~
28 ~~time when, because of insufficient light or unfavorable atmospheric~~
29 ~~conditions, persons and vehicles on the highway are not clearly discernible~~
30 ~~at a distance of 1,000 feet ahead shall~~ **, subject to exceptions with respect**
31 **to parked vehicles as stated in this chapter, must** display lighted lamps
32 and illuminating devices as respectively required in this chapter for
33 different classes of vehicles ~~subject to exceptions with respect to parked~~
34 ~~vehicles as stated in this chapter.~~ :

35 **(a) At any time from one-half hour after sunset to one-half hour**
36 **before sunrise;**

37 **(b) At any other time when, because of insufficient light or**
38 **unfavorable atmospheric conditions, persons and vehicles on the**
39 **highway are not clearly discernible at a distance of 1,000 feet ahead; and**

40 **(c) When directed by an official traffic control device.**

41 2. Every vehicle upon a highway ~~shall~~ **must** be equipped with stop
42 lights, turn signals and other signaling devices to be lighted in the manner
43 prescribed for the use of such devices.

44 **Sec. 6.** NRS 484.737 is hereby amended to read as follows:

45 484.737 1. ~~A~~ **Except as otherwise provided in this section, a**
46 person shall not drive, move, stop or park any vehicle or combination of
47 vehicles, and an owner shall not cause or knowingly permit any vehicle or
48 combination of vehicles to be driven, moved, stopped or parked, on any
49 highway if ~~such~~ **the** vehicle or combination of vehicles exceeds in size or



1 weight or gross loaded weight the maximum limitation specified by law ~~has~~
2 ~~to such~~ *for that* size, weight and gross loaded weight unless ~~such~~ *the*
3 person or owner is authorized to drive, move, stop or park ~~such~~ *the*
4 vehicle or combination of vehicles by a special permit issued by the proper
5 public authority.

6 2. *If the department of transportation or a local law enforcement*
7 *agency determines that an emergency exists, the department or the local*
8 *law enforcement agency may authorize a person to drive, move, stop or*
9 *park a vehicle or combination of vehicles without obtaining a special*
10 *permit pursuant to subsection 1. Such an authorization may be given*
11 *orally and may, if requested by a local law enforcement agency or a*
12 *public safety agency, include driving or moving the vehicle or*
13 *combination of vehicles to and from the site of the emergency. If a*
14 *person receives such an authorization, he shall, on the next business day*
15 *after receiving the authorization, obtain a special permit pursuant to*
16 *subsection 1 before driving or moving the vehicle or combination of*
17 *vehicles to or from the site of the emergency.*

18 3. This section does not apply to fire apparatus, highway machinery ~~or~~
19 ~~or~~ snowplows or to a farm tractor or other implement of husbandry
20 temporarily moved upon a highway.

21 **Sec. 7.** NRS 408.321 is hereby amended to read as follows:

22 408.321 The department shall ~~integrate~~ , *in accordance with*
23 *appropriate standards of design:*

24 1. *Integrate* the consideration of motor vehicle recovery and bicycle
25 lanes and bicycle routes, facilities and signs into all plans, designs,
26 construction and maintenance of highways ~~or, in accordance with~~
27 ~~appropriate standards of design~~ ; and

28 2. *To the extent practicable, integrate the consideration of periodic*
29 *turnouts for slower vehicles into plans, designs, construction and*
30 *maintenance of highways that have one lane for traveling in each*
31 *direction.*

32 **Sec. 8.** The amendatory provisions of this act do not apply to offenses
33 committed before October 1, 2001.
