SUMMARY—Limits enforceability of certain contracts in restraint of trade. (BDR 53-189)

AN ACT relating to employment practices; limiting the enforceability of certain contracts and agreements that restrain persons from engaging in a lawful profession, trade or business; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Chapter 613 of NRS is hereby amended by adding thereto a new section to read as follows:

- 1. Except as otherwise provided in subsection 2, a provision of a contract or agreement that restrains a person from engaging in a lawful profession, trade or business is void.
 - 2. The provisions of subsection 1 do not prohibit:
- (a) A shareholder of a corporation who sells or otherwise disposes of:
 - (1) All of his shares in the corporation;
- 9 (2) All or substantially all of the operating assets of the corporation and the goodwill of the corporation;
 11 (3) All or substantially all of the operating assets of a division or a
 - (3) All or substantially all of the operating assets of a division or a subsidiary of the corporation and the goodwill of the division or subsidiary; or
 - (4) All of the shares of any subsidiary of the corporation,
 - may agree with the buyer to refrain from carrying on a similar business within a specified county or counties, city or cities, or any part thereof, in which the business of the corporation, division or subsidiary has been transacted, so long as the buyer or any other person deriving title to the shares or goodwill from the buyer, carries on a similar business in that area.
 - (b) A partner may, upon or in anticipation of the dissolution of the partnership, the dissociation of the partner from the partnership, or the



assignment or other conveyance of the partner's interest in the partnership, agree that he will not carry on a similar business within a specified county or counties, city or cities, or any part thereof, in which the business of the partnership has been transacted, so long as any other partner, or any person who obtains an interest in the partnership from any other partner, carries on a similar business in that area.

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 (c) A member of a limited-liability company may, upon or in anticipation of the dissolution of the limited-liability company or the transfer or assignment of his interest in the limited-liability company, agree that he will not carry on a similar business within a specified county or counties, city or cities, or any part thereof, in which the business of the limited-liability company has been transacted, so long as any other member of the company, or any person who obtains an interest in the limited-liability company from another member of the company, carries on a similar business in that area.

(d) A person who sells the goodwill of a business may agree with the buyer to refrain from carrying on a similar business within a specified county or counties, city or cities, or any part thereof, in which the business has been transacted, so long as the buyer or any other person deriving title to the goodwill from the buyer carries on a similar business in that area.

(e) A person from negotiating, executing and enforcing an agreement with an employee of the person that, upon termination of the employment, prohibits the employee from disclosing any trade secrets, business methods, lists of customers, secret formulas or confidential information learned or obtained during the course of his employment with the person, if the agreement is supported by valuable consideration and is otherwise reasonable in its scope and duration.

(f) The displacement or limitation of competition otherwise authorized by a specific statute.

(g) A person who holds a license issued pursuant to chapter 463 or 464 of NRS or who is required to register with the Nevada gaming commission pursuant to chapter 463 of NRS from negotiating, executing and enforcing an agreement with an employee of the person that, upon termination of the employment, prohibits the employee from pursuing a similar vocation in competition with or becoming employed by a competitor of the person, if the agreement is supported by valuable consideration and is otherwise reasonable in its scope and duration.

3. As used in this section, "subsidiary" means a corporation a majority of whose voting shares are owned by another corporation.

Sec. 2. NRS 613.200 is hereby amended to read as follows:

613.200 1. Except as otherwise provided in subsection 2 [,] and section 1 of this act, any person, [association, company or corporation] within this state, or any agent or officer on behalf of the person, [association, company or corporation,] who willfully does anything intended to prevent any person who for any cause left or was discharged from his or its employ from obtaining employment elsewhere in this state shall be punished by a fine of not more than \$5,000. If a fine is imposed



pursuant to this section, the costs of the proceeding, including investigative costs and attorney's fees, may be recovered by the labor commissioner.

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- 2. The provisions of subsection 1 do not prohibit a person, [association, company, corporation,] agent or officer from negotiating, executing and enforcing an agreement with an employee of the person [, association, company or corporation which, upon termination of the employment, prohibits the employee from:
- (a) Pursuing a similar vocation in competition with or becoming employed by a competitor of the person , association, company or corporation; or;
- (b) Disclosing any trade secrets, business methods, lists of customers, secret formulas or processes or confidential information learned or obtained during the course of his employment with the person,
- if the agreement is supported by valuable consideration, and is otherwise 15 reasonable in its scope and duration [, and is not otherwise void 16 pursuant to section 1 of this act.

 Sec. 3. The provisions of section 1 of this act apply to contracts and 17
 - agreements entered into on or after October 1, 2001.
