## SENATE BILL NO. 58-SENATOR TOWNSEND

SUMMARY—Creates Nevada commission on children and families. (BDR 18-1067)

AN ACT relating to the state executive department; creating the Nevada commission on children and families; establishing its powers and duties; requiring the director of the department of human resources to provide certain staff assistance to the commission; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

- **Section 1.** Title 18 of NRS is hereby amended by adding thereto a new chapter to consist of the provisions set forth as sections 2 to 9, inclusive, of this act.
- Sec. 2. As used in this chapter, unless the context otherwise requires, "commission" means the Nevada commission on children and families.
- Sec. 3. 1. The Nevada commission on children and families, consisting of 12 members appointed by the governor, is hereby created.
- 2. The governor shall designate one member of the commission to serve as chairman and one member of the commission to serve as vice chairman.
- 3. Each chairman, vice chairman and other officer of the commission shall serve for a term of 4 years.
- 4. No more than six members of the commission may be from the same political party.
- Sec. 4. 1. Except for the initial members, the term of office of each member of the commission is 4 years and commences on July 1 of the year of appointment. The members shall continue in office until their successors are appointed. Members are eligible for reappointment, except that no member may serve for any part of more than two consecutive

terms. Vacancies must be filled by appointment for the unexpired terms by the governor.

- 2. Members of the commission serve without compensation, but are entitled to be reimbursed for all travel and other expenses actually and necessarily incurred in the performance of their duties, within the limits of available money.
- Sec. 5. 1. The commission shall meet at the call of the chairman as frequently as required to perform its duties, but not less than quarterly. A majority of the members of the commission constitutes a quorum for the transaction of business, and a majority of a quorum present at any meeting is sufficient for any official action taken by the commission.

2. The chairman of the commission may, with the approval of the commission, appoint committees from among its members to assist in carrying out the functions or duties of the commission.

Sec. 6. The commission shall:

- 1. In cooperation with interested state and local public and private entities:
- (a) Promote community efforts and responsibility for the well-being of children and families in this state.
- (b) Establish policies for the provision of services to children and families in this state that assist in the development of a stable, safe and healthful environment for those children and families.
- 2. Identify, foster and evaluate programs, services and resources for children and families in this state.
- 3. Identify inefficiencies, duplications and deficiencies in programs, services and resources for children and families in this state.
- 4. Identify and monitor the availability and use of federal, state and local public and private funding for programs, services and resources for children and families in this state.
- 5. Identify and evaluate the provisions of the state budget that affect programs, services and resources for children and families in this state.
- 6. On or before November I of each year, submit a report to the governor and the legislative commission summarizing the activities, needs and recommendations of the commission.
- Sec. 7. 1. The commission shall appoint an executive director who is in the unclassified service of the state and serves at the pleasure of the commission. The executive director is entitled to an annual salary as fixed by the commission within the limits of available money.
- 2. The executive director shall administer the provisions of this chapter under the direction and supervision of the commission.
- Sec. 8. 1. The director of the department of human resources shall provide such staff and assistance to the commission as the governor deems appropriate.
- 2. The commission may engage the services of such volunteer workers and consultants without salary as it deems necessary.
- Sec. 9. The commission may apply for and receive gifts, grants, contributions or other money from the Federal Government, private agencies, affiliated associations and other persons for the purposes of

carrying out the provisions of this chapter and for defraying expenses incurred by the commission in the discharge of its duties.

Sec. 10. As soon as practicable after July 1, 2001, the governor shall 3 appoint to the Nevada commission on children and families: 5

- Three members whose terms expire on June 30, 2002.
- Three members whose terms expire on June 30, 2003.
- 7 Three members whose terms expire on June 30, 2004.
- Three members whose terms expire on June 30, 2005. 8
- **Sec. 11.** This act becomes effective on July 1, 2001.
