## SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 31–SENATOR RHOADS

## APRIL 9, 2001

## Referred to Committee on Legislative Affairs and Operations

SUMMARY—Directs Legislative Commission to conduct interim study of organizational structure of agricultural extension program at University of Nevada, Reno. (BDR R-1044)

EXPLANATION - Matter in bolded italics is new; matter between brackets formitted materiall is material to be omitted.

SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION—Directing the Legislative Commission to conduct an interim study of the organizational structure of the agricultural extension program at the University of Nevada, Reno.

WHEREAS, Many residents of Nevada have expressed concerns over the recent administrative separation of the agricultural extension program from the College of Agriculture, Biotechnology, and Natural Resources at the University of Nevada, Reno; and

WHEREAS, The residents of Nevada have enjoyed the direct benefits of research and related educational opportunities through the seamless integration of the Nevada Cooperative Extension, the Nevada Agricultural Experiment Station and the College of Agriculture, Biotechnology, and Natural Resources, and until recently these efforts were supervised by one dean; and

WHEREAS, The result of the administrative change is a breakdown of the system whereby the community needs are reflected in the on-campus research agenda and research-based information generated by on-campus faculty researchers is disseminated by cooperative extension educational programs; and

WHEREAS, There have been suggestions that resources available for programming have been reduced as a result of multiple administrative units, where one administrative unit sufficed before; and

WHEREAS, The residents of Nevada are being denied a simple and direct means of accessing the complete resources of the University regarding agricultural issues; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, THE ASSEMBLY CONCURRING, That the Legislative Commission is hereby directed to appoint an interim committee to conduct a study of the organizational structure of the agricultural extension program at the University of Nevada, Reno; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the interim committee must consist of six members appointed as follows:



1. Three members of the Senate, one of whom represents the northern area of the state, one of whom represents the southern area of the state, and one of whom represents a rural area of the state; and

2. Three members of the Assembly, one of whom represents the northern area of the state, one of whom represents the southern area of the state, and one of whom represents a rural area of the state; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the chairman of the interim committee shall appoint a nonvoting advisory committee to assist in conducting the study; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the nonvoting advisory committee must consist of nine members appointed as follows:

- 1. Two members who represent the faculty of the University of Nevada;
  - 2. Two members who represent agricultural organizations in this state;
- 3. Two members of the general public each of whom are knowledgeable of agricultural issues and reside in a rural area of this state;
- 4. One member of the general public who is knowledgeable of agricultural issues and resides in Clark County;
- 5. One member of the general public who is knowledgeable of agricultural issues and resides in Washoe County; and
- 6. One member who is a member of the State Bar of Nevada and knowledgeable of laws related to agricultural issues; and be it further

RESOLVED, That each member of the advisory committee shall serve without compensation, except that while he is engaged in the business of the committee he is entitled to receive the per diem allowance and travel expenses provided for state officers and employees generally, which must be paid from the legislative fund; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the study must include, without limitation:

- 1. A review of the legal and administrative procedures that were followed in changing the organizational structure of the agricultural extension program to establish it as an independent unit of the University of Nevada:
- 2. An evaluation of the effectiveness of the new organizational structure in promoting the integration of the educational programs of the Nevada Cooperative Extension with the research programs of the College of Agriculture, Biotechnology, and Natural Resources and the Nevada Agricultural Experiment Station;
- 3. A review of the compliance of the new organization with the requirements of applicable federal and state laws, statutes and regulations;
- 4. An assessment of the fiscal effects of the new organizational structure in terms of the increased administrative costs and costs of its programs;
- 5. An evaluation of the effects of the new organizational structure on the performance evaluations of faculty, advancements in rank and salary of faculty, and program direction and supervision, both in the College of Agriculture, Biotechnology, and Natural Resources and Nevada Cooperative Extension;



6. A comparison of the different organizational structures for similar programs in the land grant universities in other states and their relative effectiveness; and

 7. Specific recommendations with respect to the optimum organizational structure for this program, effective operating procedures and other mechanisms necessary to improve service to the public; and be it further

RESOLVED, That any recommended legislation proposed by the interim committee must be approved by a majority of the members of the Senate and a majority of the members of the Assembly appointed to the interim committee; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Legislative Commission shall submit a report of the results of the study and any recommendations for legislation to the 72nd session of the Nevada Legislature.
