SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION—Supporting the construction and operation of a performing arts center in Southern Nevada.

- 1 WHEREAS, For more than 5 years, several groups in the Las Vegas
- 2 Valley have sought support for the construction and operation of an
- 3 upscale performing arts center to be built in or near the City of Las Vegas;
- 4 and
- 5 WHEREAS, Supporters of this initiative propose that such a state-of-the-
- 6 art facility would bring top-notch theater, opera and concert performances
- 7 to the Las Vegas area, thereby encouraging further economic and cultural
- 8 development in Southern Nevada and fostering an appreciation of and
- 9 support for the performing arts in the community; and
- 10 WHEREAS, Local government officials and community leaders believe
- 11 that the construction and operation of a performing arts center should be
- 12 both a public and private partnership, with the private sector and local
- 13 government providing substantial monetary support for the development,



1 operation and maintenance of the facility, and public sources providing
2 money for the construction of the facility; and

3 WHEREAS, The groups proposing the performing arts center have set
4 forth the following goals and objectives, the accomplishment of which they
5 believe will serve as evidence of substantial support for the center:

6 1. Commitment, at no cost to the State of Nevada, of a suitable and
7 prominent site for the construction of the performing arts center; and

8 2. Commitment from private and local sources, at no cost to the State
9 of Nevada, of sufficient funds and services to ensure that the performing
10 arts center will be operated and maintained without any need for subsidies
11 or appropriations from the state; now, therefore, be it

12 RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, THE ASSEMBLY
13 CONCURRING, That the members of the 71st session of the Nevada
14 Legislature do hereby support the construction and operation of a
15 performing arts center in Southern Nevada which will encourage further
16 economic and cultural development in the Las Vegas Valley; and be it
17 further

18 RESOLVED, That the members of the Legislature commend the local
19 government officials and community leaders for their efforts thus far in
20 bringing a performing arts center to the residents of and visitors to
21 Southern Nevada; and be it further

22 RESOLVED, That the accomplishment of the goals and objectives set
23 forth by the groups proposing the performing arts center will demonstrate
24 that the supporters of this initiative are ready to move forward and seek a
25 public means for funding the construction of the center, including, for
26 example, the sale of revenue bonds; and be it further

27 RESOLVED, That the Secretary of the Senate prepare and transmit a copy
28 of this resolution to Don Snyder, a member of the Las Vegas Performing
29 Arts Center Foundation Board and an ardent supporter of this initiative.
