SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION—Directing the Legislative Commission to conduct an interim study of the feasibility of constructing a highway between Mesquite and Caliente.

WHEREAS, The construction of a highway between Mesquite and Caliente would mitigate the effects of the isolation and inaccessibility of Caliente and the surrounding area; and

WHEREAS, The construction of a highway between Mesquite and Caliente would provide a direct route from Mesquite to U.S. Highway No. 93 and would complete the corridor from Los Angeles to Salt Lake City; and

WHEREAS, The construction of such a highway would greatly improve access to the Great Basin National Park; and

WHEREAS, The construction of such a highway would help to promote tourism and provide economic benefits to this state; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, THE ASSEMBLY CONCURRING, That the Legislative Commission is hereby directed to conduct an interim study of the feasibility of constructing a highway between Mesquite and Caliente; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Legislative Commission shall appoint a subcommittee, consisting of three members of the Senate and three members of the Assembly to conduct the study; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Director of the Department of Transportation shall assist the subcommittee in conducting the study; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the study must include, without limitation:

- 1. An analysis of the types of highways that may be constructed and the approximate cost to construct each type of highway;
- 2. An estimate of the number of vehicles that would use the highway each year;
- 3. An analysis of the benefits of constructing the highway, including a monetary estimate of the economic benefits to this state; and



4. An analysis of whether such a highway should be constructed; and 2 3 4 5 be it further

RESOLVED, That any recommended legislation proposed by the subcommittee must be approved by a majority of the members of the Senate and a majority of the members of the Assembly appointed to the subcommittee; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Legislative Commission shall submit a report of the results of the study and any recommended legislation to the 72nd session of the Nevada Legislature.
