This proposal attempts to achieve several goals relating to campaign contribution and expenditure ( C&E ) reporting:	1. Make filing an annual requirement for elected officials, candidates, Committees for Political Action (PÁCs), Ballot Advocacy Groups (BAGs), and political parties for those "non election" years yet still maintain the three reporting periods during an election year for candidates.  2. Combine Disposition of Unspent form, Contributions Over \$10,000 form, and Ethics Financial Disclosure form into the C & E form to be filed annually.  3. Require BAGs to register with this office just as PACs currently are required to do.  4. Make the Secretary of State the officer with whom all campaign reports are filed, which will allow for more efficient enforcement and for reports to be more readily available to the public and the press.  5. Require all reports to be electronically filed.  6. Require contributions of \$1,000 or more to be electronically reported within 24 hours.
