THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN
SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

- 1 Section 1. Chapter 304 of NRS is hereby amended by adding thereto
2 the provisions set forth as sections 2 to 8, inclusive, of this act.
3 Sec. 2. *As used in sections 2 to 8, inclusive, of this act, unless the*
4 *context otherwise requires, the words and terms defined in sections 3, 4*
5 *and 5 of this act have the meanings ascribed to them in those sections.*
6 Sec. 3. "Catastrophe" means a natural or man-made event that
7 causes a vacancy in at least one-fourth of the total number of offices in
8 the United States House of Representatives, including any number of
9 offices representing the State of Nevada, or at least one-half of the total
10 number of offices representing the State of Nevada.
11 Sec. 4. "Disappearance" means the inability to establish
12 conclusively whether a Representative in Congress has survived a
13 catastrophe.
14 Sec. 5. "Vacancy" means *the death, resignation or declination of a*
15 *Representative in Congress, or the death or disappearance, as a result of*
16 *a Representative in Congress of a resulting from a catastrophe, of a*
17 ~~Representative in Congress~~ *as defined in Section 3 of this act.*

1 Sec. 6. In the event of a catastrophe vacancy in the office of
2 Representative in Congress, the Governor shall issue an election
3 proclamation within seven calendar days of the event giving rise to the
4 vacancy calling for a special election to fill a the vacancy in the office of
5 Representative in Congress. The Governor shall specify the date of the
6 special election in the proclamation. If the vacancy is caused by the
7 death, resignation, or declination of a Representative in Congress, the
8 election must be conducted on a Tuesday at least not more than
9 180 calendar days following the issuance of the election proclamation.
10 If the vacancy is caused by a catastrophe as defined in Section 5 of this
11 act, the election must be conducted on a Tuesday 56 days, but not more
12 than 90 calendar days, following the issuance of the election
13 proclamation, except that Under either circumstance, the special
14 election may be conducted within 90 calendar days following the
15 issuance of the election proclamation in order to consolidate the special
16 election with the next regularly scheduled:

17 1. Statewide election; or
18 2. Local election occurring wholly or partially within the same
19 territory in which the vacancy exists, if the voters eligible to vote in the
20 local election comprise at least 50 percent of all the voters eligible to vote
21 on the vacancy.

22 Sec. 7. 1. If the Governor issues an election proclamation calling
23 for a special election pursuant to section 6 of this act, no primary
24 election may be held. Except as otherwise provided in this subsection, a
25 candidate must be nominated in the manner provided in chapter 293 of
26 NRS and must file a declaration or acceptance of candidacy within the
27 time prescribed by the Secretary of State pursuant to NRS 293.204. A
28 candidate of a major political party is nominated by filing a declaration
29 or acceptance of candidacy within the time prescribed by the Secretary of
30 State pursuant to NRS 293.204. A minor political party that wishes to
31 place its candidates on the ballot must file a list of its candidates with the
32 Secretary of State not more than 46 days before the special election and
33 not less than 32 days before the special election. To have his name
34 appear on the ballot, an independent candidate must file his petition of
35 candidacy with the appropriate filing officer not more than 46 days
36 before the special election and not less than 32 days before the special
37 election.

38 2. Except as otherwise provided in sections 2 to 8, inclusive, of this
39 act:

40 (a) The election must be conducted pursuant to the provisions of
41 chapter 293 of NRS.

42 (b) The general election laws of this state apply to the election.

43 Sec. 8. The Secretary of State shall adopt such regulations as are
44 necessary for conducting elections pursuant to the provisions of sections
45 2 to 8, inclusive, of this act.

- 1 Sec. 9. NRS 304.040 is hereby amended to read as follows:
- 2 304.040 ~~{Party}~~ *Except as otherwise provided in sections 2 to 8,*
- 3 *inclusive, of this act, party* candidates for Representative in Congress shall
- 4 be nominated in the same manner as state officers are nominated.
- 5 Sec. 10. This act becomes effective upon passage and approval.
