Assembly Bill 136 permits the creation of a general improvement district (GID) for the purpose of implementing a habitat conservation plan pursuant to the Federal Endangered Species Act.

Proposed amendments:

At the hearing on the bill, concerns were expressed about the potential impact of the bill on water rights issues and grazing permits. The Lincoln County Commission proposed amendments to address these concerns.

A mock-up of the proposed amendments deleting the reference to "water rights, grazing permits" is attached.

Testimony in opposition:

The Sierra Club and the Nevada Committee for Full Statehood opposed the bill (although for different

reasons).

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Chapter 318 of NRS is hereby amended by adding thereto a new section to read as follows:

In the case of a district created wholly or in part for the establishment of an area or zone for the preservation of one or more species or subspecies of wildlife that has been declared endangered or threatened pursuant to the federal Endangered Species Act of 1973, 16 U.S.C. §§ 1531 et seq., the board shall have the power to:

1. Establish, control, manage and operate or provide money for the establishment, control, management and operation of the area or zone.

2. Purchase, sell, exchange or lease real property, personal property, water rights, grazing permits and other interests in such property as necessary for the establishment, control, management and operation of the area or zone.

Sec. 2. NRS 318.116 is hereby amended to read as follows:
