ASSEMBLY BILL 219

Requires Department of Administration to conduct study concerning feasibility and desirability of relocating certain state agencies to rural communities. (BDR S-1088)

Assembly Bill 219 requires the Department of Administration to appoint a committee to conduct a study on the feasibility of relocating one or more state agencies to rural communities. The committee must be composed of people knowledgeable about state government as well as people familiar with rural communities. The results of the study must be submitted to the Legislative Counsel Bureau no later than September 1, 2004. The Chief of the Budget Division of the Department of Administration must consider the results of the study in his preparation of the state budget and include at least one relocation of a state agency for Fiscal Year 2006-2007.

Proposed amendments:

At the hearing on the bill, the sponsor proposed two amendments: (1) creating a fund to receive gifts or grants for conducting the study so that state funds would not be necessary; and (2) making the relocation of a state agency discretionary (rather than mandatory).

A rough mock-up of the proposed amendments is attached.

Testimony in opposition:

There was no opposition to the bill as amended.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. 1. The Department of Administration shall conduct a study of the feasibility and desirability of relocating certain state agencies, or portions thereof, to rural communities.

2. The Director of the Department shall appoint a committee of such persons as he deems appropriate to conduct the study, including, without limitation:

(a) Persons who are familiar with the operation of State Government and the work performed by state employees; and

(b) Persons who are familiar with the services and amenities that rural communities could offer to state employees, including, without limitation:

(1) Lower costs of living;

- (2) The aesthetics of rural life;
- (3) Decreased commuting time;
- (4) An environment free from pollution, traffic congestion and high crime; and
- 16 (5) Methods of communication which are equivalent to those that 17 are available in urban areas.

- 3. In conducting the study to determine the feasibility of relocating a particular state agency, or portion thereof, the committee shall first consider the mission and programs of the agency to ensure that they do not require the employees of the agency to perform their duties or provide customer service at a specific location.
- 4. In conducting the study, the Department shall conduct a written survey of state employees who work in urban areas to determine the number of employees who would be willing to relocate to a rural community if the office in which they are currently working were to be relocated. A copy of the survey must be distributed to each such employee with the employee's payroll check, or copy thereof, and may be returned to the Director of the Department through interoffice state mail.

5. The Department shall submit a report of the results of the study on or before September 1, 2004, to the Director of the Legislative Counsel Bureau.

6. The Chief of the Budget Division of the Department shall consider the results of the study during the preparation of the proposed state budget that will be presented by the Governor in January 2005. As a result of the study, the Department shall. *if feasible*, recommend the relocation of at least one state agency, or portion thereof, to a rural community and include that relocation as part of the proposed state budget for fiscal year 2006-2007.

Amendment proposed by sponsor to change the mandatory requirement to relocate a state agency.

Sec. 2. This act becomes effective on July 1, 2003.

Section 3. The Department shall set up an account within the Department to receive grants, gifts or donations for the purpose of funding the study in Section 1. The study shall begin when adequate funds have been received to cover the cost of the study.

Amendment proposed by sponsor to avoid fiscal impact on State.
