ASSEMBLY BILL 68

Revises definition of "compensation" for purposes of provisions governing Public Employees' Retirement System. (BDR 23-725)

Assembly Bill 68 includes "extra duty pay" within the definition of compensation for purposes of calculating retirement benefits under the Public Employees' Retirement System (PERS).

Amendments:

Assemblywoman Giunchigliani presented the bill and proposed

amendments to the bill.

A mock-up of the bill with proposed amendments is attached.

Opposition:

George Pyne, Executive Director, PERS, opposed the bill noting that extra duty pay is currently considered compensation if included in the employment contract. The Clark County School District opposed the bill. The Washoe County School District supported the bill in concept but asked that implementation be delayed until 2005 to allow time for inclusion of the costs in the

budget.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. NRS 286.025 is hereby amended to read as follows: 286.025 1. Except as otherwise provided by specific statute, "compensation" is the salary paid to a member by his principal public employer.

2. The term includes:

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(a) Base pay, which is the monthly rate of pay excluding all fringe benefits.

(b) Additional payment for longevity, shift differential, hazardous duty, work performed on a holiday if it does not exceed the working hours of the normal workweek or pay period for that employee, holding oneself ready for duty while off duty and returning to duty after one's regular working hours.

(c) Payment for extra duty assignments [if it] regardless of whether:

(1) It is the standard practice of the public employer to include such pay in the employment contract or official job description for the calendar or academic year in which it is paid {and such}; or

(2) Such pay is specifically included in the member's employment

contract or official job description.

(d) The aggregate compensation paid by two separate public employers if one member is employed half time or more by one, and half time or less by the other, if the total does not exceed full-time employment, if the duties of both positions are similar and if the employment is pursuant to a continuing relationship between the employers.

(e) Payments to:

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(1) A member who is employed by a school district for less than 12 months during a school year for any service rendered to the school district after the expiration of the employment contract for that period of employment and before the beginning of the next school year; or

(2) A member of the professional staff of the University and Community College System of Nevada employed for the academic year who is employed for less than 12 months during a fiscal year for any service rendered to the University and Community College System of Nevada after the expiration of the employment contract for that period of employment and before the beginning of the next fiscal year.

3. The term does not include any type of payment not specifically described in subsection 2.

Sec. 2. NRS xxx.xxx is hereby amended as follows:

Section 3. NRS xxx.xxx is hereby amended as follows:

Section 4. This act becomes effective on July 1, 2003.

At the request of the bill's sponsor, this new section will permit the employee to choose whether or not to pay retirement on the portion of their compensation that is attributable to the extra duty assignment. It is the intent of the bill sponsor that, if the employee elects to pay retirement on the extra duty compensation, the extra duty compensation will be reduced by the amount of the employee's contribution to retirement.

This section is deleted at the request of the bill's sponsor.

At the request of the bill's sponsor, this new section will contain a definition of "extra duty assignment" to provide that, at a minimum, the following activities are included: teaching evening classes for adult education or ESL; coaching sports programs or intramurals; teaching summer school/intersession, or remediation classes; and conducting extracurricular or co-curricular activities such as speech club, pep club, band, orchestra, yearbook or newspaper.

BDR 23-725 - Fiscal Note

Explanation:

This bill expands the definition of compensation subject to retirement contribution for payment of all extra duty assignments to include summer assignments for certain school district and university employees.

State and local governments and the university system have indicated this bill would have a minimal fiscal impact. It appears to be mostly applicable to school employees on contract. Most university professional staff on contract do not participate in PERS.

Assumptions:

- The Clark County School District and Washoe County School District supplied payroll information for preparation of this fiscal note upon which additional cost assumptions were made.
- The payroll cost is calculated at 20.25% of additional pay that would be subject to retirement contribution.
- Fiscal year 2004/05 reflects a 5% inflation increase over fiscal year 2003/04.
- The effect on future biennia column is not indexed to inflation

Payroll Cost Increases:

Additional annual contribution cost for fiscal year 2003, is calculated as follows:

Clark County Schools \$19,229,712.34 X 20.25%*

*20.25% is employer pay contribution rate effective 7/1/2003.

Retirement Contribution Costs:

Retirement contribution increase is estimated to be .05% of payroll, which would not trigger an increase in contribution rates under NRS 286.421. The actuarially determined rate is presently 20.32%. Adding .05% results in 20.37% of payroll. A rate of 20.375 would trigger a contribution rate increase to 20.5%.
