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NRS 202.2491 – In Section 1:1(e) The law already

prohibits smoking in the “**Public area of a store principally devoted to the sale of food for human consumption of the premises** – a grocery store.

- AB 202 repeals the exceptions to this law in Section 2:b (1), (2). That excepted the areas devoted to slot machines.

- AB 202 repeals the “compromise” that was reached in 1999 that requires separate ventilation for these areas and a segregation by two or more partial walls and a bank of slot machines to be installed by 2010.

- AB 202 Section 2:1& 2 does allow smoking in the slot machine area in a completely segregated room and the stores will be posted prohibiting smoking except for those areas.

Environmental Tobacco Smoke

(Passive smoking)

- The facts –
 1. Contains hydrogen cyanide, carbon monoxide, and dozens of compounds that are known to cause cancer.
 2. Associated with lung Cancer, heart disease, Sudden Infant Death Syndrome, ear infections, asthma, bronchitis, and pneumonia.
- Lung cancer passive smoking risk increased by 20-30%
- Non-smokers living with a smoke increased risk 23%
- EPA concludes ETS is a Class A carcinogen responsible for 3000 lung cancers in non-smokers annually and up to 300,000 cases annually of respiratory illness in children under 18 months old.

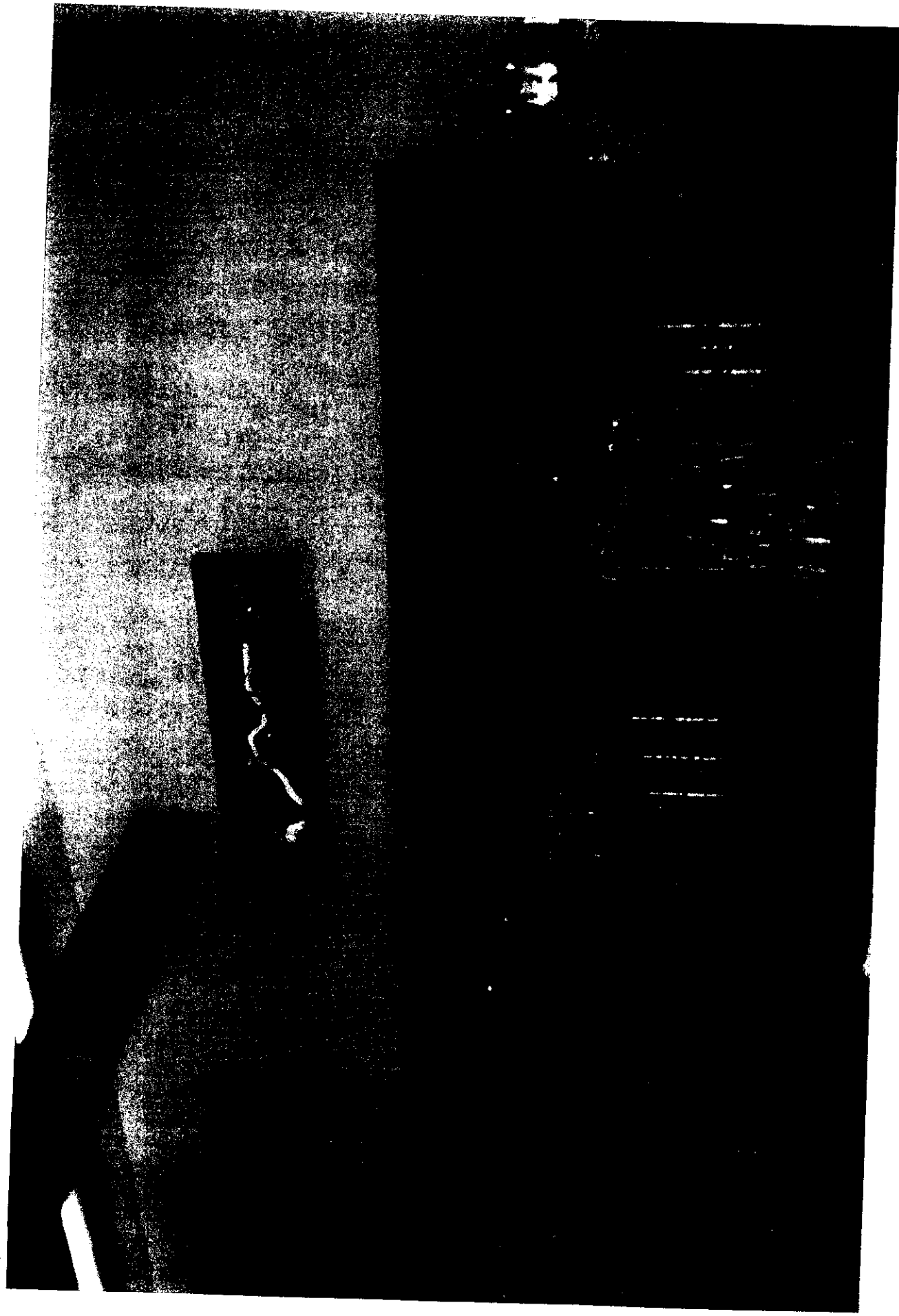

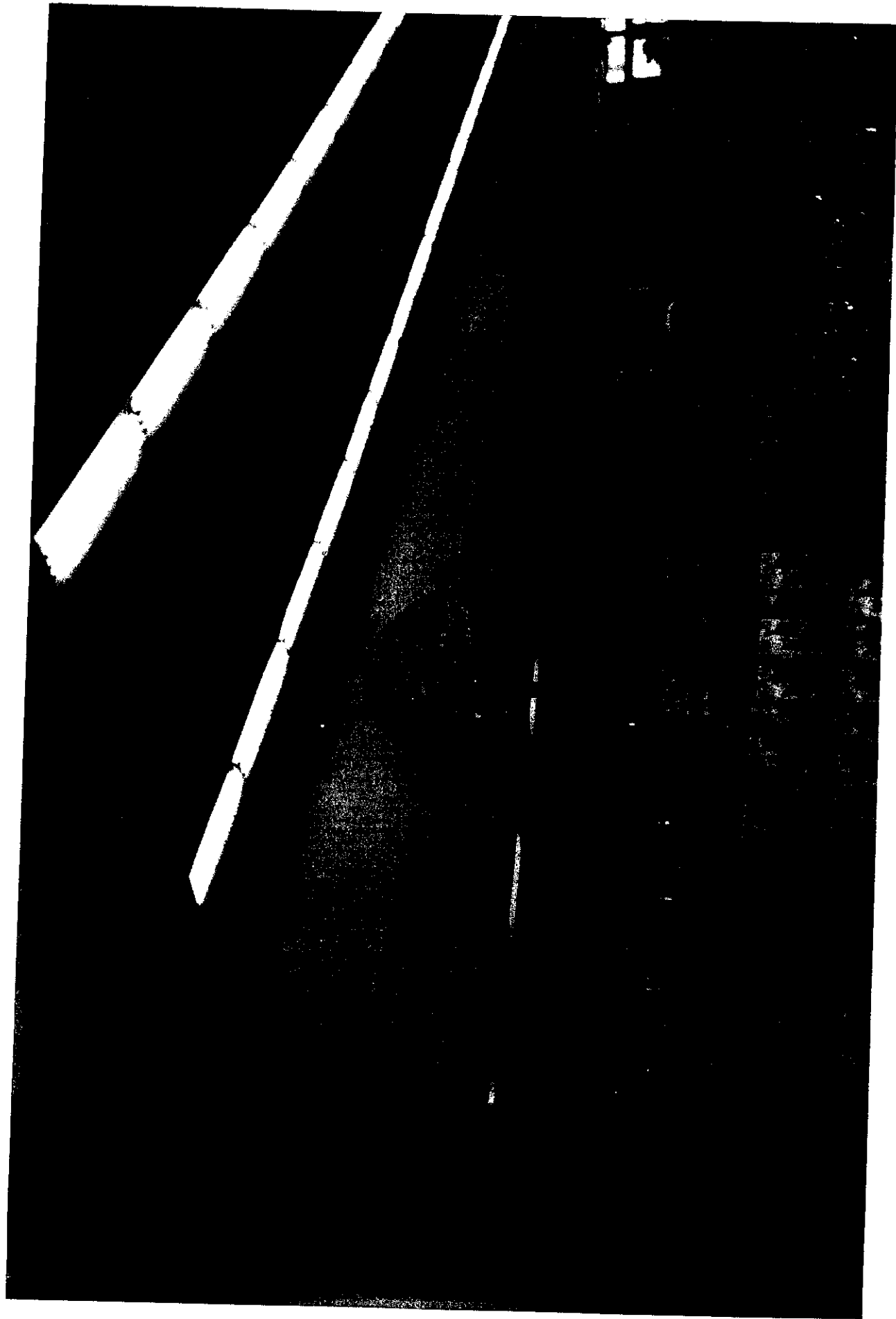
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
