Dear Chairperson Anderson and Members of the Committee:

I would like to submit this letter as my written support for this Bill. I am presently serving as a professional guardian and co-guardian for several Wards in Clark County.

Certain aspects of the current guardianship statutes are inadequate. For example, the guardian's duties are largely ambiguous as the statutes are not clear on what requires prior court approval and what actions are within my discretion. Our family court does not have legal authority to entertain certain trust matters, which can cause two actions in two courts to be needed, causing delay and unnecessary costs.

As a professional guardian, it is sometimes necessary for me to resign and the current statutes do not have a procedure for a guardian to resign. Upon the death of a Ward, there are many tasks to complete, such as final tax matters. These take more time than the current statutes allow.

The changes in AB365 seem to rectify these problems, and the changes in AB365 are clearly an improvement to the guardianship statutes. I hope that you, as members of the Assembly Judiciary Committee, understand and see the need for these proposed changes and will assist in the passage of AB365.

Thank you for your consideration of my concerns.
