

We would like to strongly encourage your support of SB 420 which will allow the Board of Wildlife Commissioners to periodically adjust fees based on the Consumer Price Index, allows the Division to suspend, revoke or refuse to issue or renew any tag, permit, or certificate of a person who does not pay a civil penalty in a timely manner, prohibiting certain persons from hunting certain upland game birds under certain circumstances, and creates the Wildlife Obligated Reserve Account in the State General Fund.

NDOW has not been able to keep up with expense because of inflation and is in danger of not providing services to the Nevada Citizens. - The proposed legislation to allow the Commission to review and <u>approve</u> the annual fiscal budget for the current Division of Wildlife.
- The proposed legislation to no longer operate under the umbrella of the Department of Natural Resources, but to revert back to department status with a direct link to the governor.

Dear Mr. Liakopoulos:

Thank you for writing recently to voice your support of Senate Bill (S.B.) 420, a measure that will allow the Nevada Department of Wildlife (NDOW) to adjust its fee schedules in accord with the Consumer Price Index (CPI) and thereby generate increased revenue to fund, among other things, continuing conservation efforts.

Because this bill will have a fiscal impact on government, it has been declared exempt from the deadlines that other bills must meet throughout the course of the Legislative Session. For this reason the Senste Finance Committee chose to delay action on S.B. 420 while we review the ramifications of tying NDOW fee schedules to the CPI. However, I agree with you that revising NDOWs fee gathering abilities will go a long way toward ensuring the continued health and viability of Nevada's wildlife populations and habitats. It is my hope that S.B. 420 will be enacted whether in its current form or with slight amendments.
