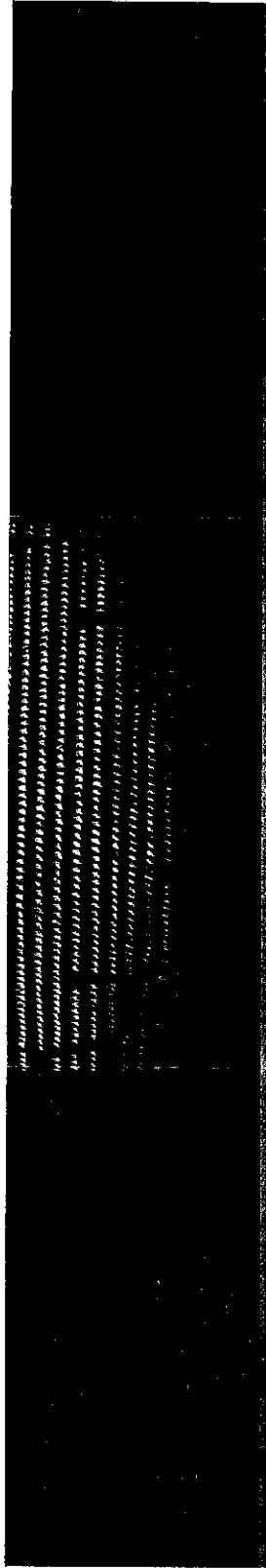

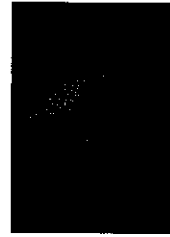

UNDER ONE SKY explores Native American origins through their traditional stories and through archaeological discoveries. A reconstructed cross-section from a typical Great Basin archaeological site reveals dramatic changes over 14,000 years.

The historic era presented Native Americans with their greatest challenge. Traditional lifeways were no longer possible, and many aspects of their culture were lost forever. **UNDER ONE SKY** is part of Native Americans' efforts toward rediscovering their culture and demonstrating their resolve to continue into the future.

Contemporary Native American artists display traditional and non-traditional works of art in the **UNDER ONE SKY** Changing Art Gallery. Many of the artists' works are available for purchase through the Museum Store. The **UNDER ONE SKY** Discovery Room provides young visitors with a variety of activities related to the exhibition.

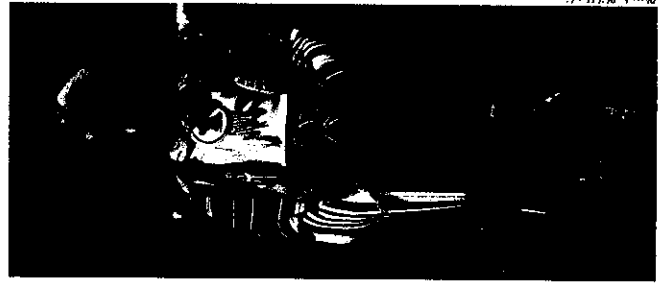
