Current Services to Wendover

- **WELFARE DIVISION**
 - 117 cases, includes TANF, Food Stamp and Medicaid cases
 - Staffing standard is 237 cases per worker
 - Food stamp and Medicaid interviews conducted by phone
 - Interview appointments scheduled in Elko when Wendover residents are making trips to Elko
 - Division will try to establish monthly visits to Wendover to create a presence in the community
- **DIVISION OF CHILD AND FAMILY SERVICES**
 - Average of 4 reports of child abuse/neglect per month
 - Average of 5 ongoing supervision abuse/neglect cases per month
 - Average of 4 substitute foster care cases per month
- **HEALTH DIVISION**
 - Bureau of Alcohol and Drug Abuse
 - Sub-grantee, Vitality Center, has an outpatient treatment center in Wendover. Number of admissions for CY 2002: 11 persons.
 - Elko Vitality Center provides detoxification and residential services. Number of admissions for CY 2002: 5 Wendover residents.
 - Bureau of Community Health
 - Statistics for last year: 246 immunizations, 74 TB, 1 STD, 8 home visits, 1 well child, 5 adult education.
 - Bureau of Family Health Services
 - Approximately 500 Nevada WIC clients in Wendover are now served by Utah WIC.
- **MENTAL HEALTH/DEVELOPMENTAL SERVICES DIVISION**
 - Rural Clinics receives about 3 referrals per month. Additional staff for Elko have been included in the Gov. Rec budget. If positions are funded, Elko will initiate an itinerant run weekly to Wendover.
- **DIVISION FOR AGING SERVICES**
 - Responds to reports of elder abuse/neglect from Elko office. Last year 3 reports were received from Wendover.
 - No clients or referrals from Wendover at this time for Community Homebased Initiatives Program, Group Care Waiver Program or Homemaking Program
