My name is Scott Watts and I am the President of NARA. I am here today to advise you that NARA strongly supports Assemblyman Clayborn's bill - AB 389. This will directly affect many of our members in Nevada.

NARA represent over 5,000 seniors and retirees in the State of Nevada. This legislation will close the loopholes that allows commercial corporations to get into banking. We are aware that such corporations, in the past, have used its access to personal, medical and financial records to build customer profiles, and then to begin marketing to those customers. In the case of older Americans, the "profile" targets those with health problems, advanced age and high credit debt. Then they are contacted and sold unneeded debt insurance. In many cases the insurance payments were large in comparison to the debts of the person. This is just another avenue large used by businesses to victimize the elderly.
