SECTION I – STATUTORY MANDATE, PROGRAM DESCRIPTIONS, PUBLIC PURPOSE AND CRITICAL NEED

1A - Statutory Mandate

The Department of Public Safety, Fire Marshal Division was created and performs it duties under the authority of NRS 477. Added references of duties and powers are found in the following: NRS 432, 244, 392, 394, 424, 331, 244, 481, 475 and 629.

1B - Program Descriptions

The Department of Public Safety, State Fire Marshal Division is responsible for fire and life safety inspections, arson investigation, building plan examination, training and licensing of the fire protections industry and the National Fire Incident Reporting System.

The mission of the State Fire Marshal Division is to provide citizens, visitors and the fire service in the State of Nevada a safe environment in which to live, visit and work. This is accomplished through education, training, inspection, licensing, permitting, informational programs, public service announcements, plans review and investigation. The adoption of codes and regulations are designed to prevent injury or death and property loss due to fire, hazardous materials incidents and manmade incidents that may expose the public and first responders to injury in the event of an emergency.

A license, issued by the State Fire Marshal, is required for maintenance, installation or sale of fire extinguishers, fire alarm systems or fire sprinkler systems, use of explosives in any commercial construction, and commercial fireworks displays.

When companies or individuals operate outside of regulatory requirements the State Fire Marshal's deputies investigate complaints, hold show-cause hearings and if necessary make arrests.
