I understand that there will be opportunity for testimony on February 25, 2003, concerning contemplated changes in the DSA. Due to several circumstances, we cannot attend this meeting; however, I would like to submit the following statement so that it might be entered into the record on this matter.

I would like to make the Committee aware of the effect the recommendation to change the "hold harmless" provision will have on the Elko County Schools. The change from a two year to a one year "hold harmless" will have a severe impact on our district at a time when we have very little equity with which to absorb a decrease of this magnitude.

As of now, the majority of school districts in Nevada are experiencing decreasing enrollments, therefore bringing into play "hold harmless." The Elko County School District is no different, and we have utilized the "hold harmless" provision for the past five fiscal years.

The change in the "hold harmless" provision that was made in the last legislative session positively impacted all rural districts to provide some insulation for rapidly increasing insurance and utility costs, as well as the staffing and program reductions most districts have been experiencing. Even under the current two year "hold harmless," the Elko County School District will recognize a \$1,113,961 decrease in Distributive School Account funds FY04. If the provision is changed to one year, the district will lose an additional \$763,887 in FY04 and \$640,332 in FY05.

With the estimated increase of \$600,000 for the PERS adjustment, \$1 million for increased health insurance premiums, \$500,000 for increased utility costs, increased fuel costs and salary roll-up, the additional decrease of \$763,887 would have a catastrophic effect on our school district.

The district has been fiscally responsible in previous years to reduce expenditures, while continuing to provide quality educational programs to all of our students. The enormity of this decrease would require us to seriously impact programs and opportunities for our children. The Elko County School District would greatly appreciate this Committee's recommendation to maintain the two year "hold harmless" provision for the benefit of all our students and staff.
