Dear Assemblywoman Giunchigliani,

Thank you for your leadership in sponsoring Assembly Bill 337 to restore voting rights and to remove economic barriers for ex-felons. Ex-felons who have completed all conditions of their sentences have earned all the rights of full citizenship.

Penalizing people who have fulfilled their sentence is unjust. Because Nevada disproportionately convicts and jails people of color, continual economic and civil rights restrictions prevent communities of color from accessing the ballot box and living wage jobs.

Full civil rights and economic opportunities ease reintegration into society and make our communities stronger. Voting members of society are less likely to re-offend, and easier access to jobs will help ex-felons support themselves and their families.

I urge all Nevada legislators to support Assembly Bill 337.
