SUMMARY—Increases compensation of certain elected county officers and authorizes board of county commissioners to set salary of county commissioners. (BDR 20-163)

AN ACT relating to public officers; increasing the compensation of certain elected county officers; authorizing a board of county commissioners to set the annual salary for a county commissioner of that county within certain limitations; authorizing a county to request and receive a waiver from the increases in compensation of certain elected county officers in the event of insufficient financial resources; providing that a waiver may not be applied for in certain circumstances; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN
SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

- 1 **Section 1.** NRS 245.043 is hereby amended to read as follows:
- 2 245.043 1. As used in this section:
- 3 (a) “County” includes Carson City.
- 4 (b) “County commissioner” includes the Mayor and supervisors
- 5 of Carson City.

2. Except as otherwise provided by any special law, the elected officers of the counties of this state are entitled to receive annual salaries in the base amounts specified in the following table. The annual salaries are in full payment for all services required by law to be performed by such officers. Except as otherwise provided by law, all fees and commissions collected by such officers in the performance of their duties must be paid into the county treasury each month without deduction of any nature.

5 **3.** *A board of county commissioners may, by a vote of at least*
6 *a majority of all the members of the board, set the annual salary*
7 *for the county commissioners of that county, but in no event may*
8 *the annual salary exceed an amount which equals 126.65 percent*
9 *of the amount of the annual salary for the county commissioners*
10 *of that county that was in effect by operation of statute on*
11 *January 1, 2003.*

12 **Sec. 2.** Except as otherwise provided in section 3 of this act,
13 each county shall commence payment of the increased annual
14 salaries of the elected officers of the county set forth in the table of
15 annual salaries contained in subsection 2 of NRS 245.043, as
16 amended by section 1 of this act, on July 1, 2003.

17 **Sec. 3.** 1. Except as otherwise provided in subsection 3, a
18 board of county commissioners may apply to the Committee on
19 Local Government Finance for a waiver from the requirement to
20 increase the annual salaries of elected officers of the county to the
21 annual salaries set forth in the table contained in subsection 2 of
22 NRS 245.043, as amended by section 1 of this act, if the board
23 determines that the financial resources of the county are insufficient
24 to pay those increased annual salaries in Fiscal Year 2003-2004. The
25 Committee on Local Government Finance shall grant such a waiver
26 if it finds that the financial resources of the county are insufficient to
27 pay those increased annual salaries in Fiscal Year 2003-2004.

28 2. A board of county commissioners that has been granted a
29 waiver for a fiscal year may apply to the Committee on Local
30 Government Finance for an additional waiver for the next
31 consecutive fiscal year if it finds that the financial resources of the
32 county continue to be insufficient to pay the increased annual
33 salaries of the elected officers of the county set forth in the table
34 contained in subsection 2 of NRS 245.043, as amended by section 1
35 of this act. There is no limitation on the number of waivers for
36 consecutive fiscal years that the board of county commissioners may
37 be granted if the board of county commissioners finds that the
38 financial resources of the county continue to be insufficient to pay
39 the increased annual salaries of the elected officers of the county set
40 forth in the table contained in subsection 2 of NRS 245.043, as
41 amended by section 1 of this act, in that fiscal year.

42 3. After commencing payment of the increased annual salaries
43 of the elected officers of the county set forth in the table contained
44 in subsection 2 of NRS 245.043, as amended by section 1 of this act,



1 a board of county commissioners may not apply for a waiver in any
2 subsequent fiscal year.

3 4. The increased annual salaries of the elected officers of the
4 county set forth in the table contained in subsection 2 of NRS
5 245.043, as amended by section 1 of this act, must not be paid
6 retroactively for a period to which a waiver granted pursuant to
7 subsection 1 is applicable.

8 **Sec. 4.** The provisions of subsection 1 of NRS 354.599 do not
9 apply to any additional expenses of a local government that are
10 related to the provisions of this act.

11 **Sec. 5.** This act becomes effective upon July 1, 2003.
