Sec. 2. NRS 704.007 is hereby amended to read as follows:
704.007 I. "Biomass" means any organic matter that is
available on a renewable basis, including, without limitation:
[1.] (a) Agricultural crops and agricultural wastes and residues;
[2.] (b) Wood and wood wastes and residues;
[3.] (c) Animal wastes;
[4.] (d) Municipal wastes; and
[5.] (e) Aquatic plants.

2. As used in this section, "municipal wastes" does not include a tire for any vehicle or device in, upon or by which any person or property is or may be transported or drawn upon land.

Sec. 3. This act becomes effective on January 1, 2004.
