AN ACT relating to education; authorizing the Board of Regents of the University of Nevada to establish an Institute for Latino Research and Advocacy; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

- **Section 1.** Chapter 396 of NRS is hereby amended by adding thereto the provisions set forth as sections 2 to 7, inclusive, of this act.
- 4 Sec. 2. The Board of Regents may establish at the University 5 of Nevada, Reno, an Institute for Latino Research and Advocacy as a facility within the System to promote research and advocacy on behalf of Latinos in the areas of public policy, education, immigration and leadership development.
- Sec. 3. The Institute for Latino Research and Advocacy may: 9 10 1. Conduct interdisciplinary research and policy analysis, and publish and distribute the results. 11
- 2. Act as a forum for persons to address issues relevant to 12 13 Latinos in this state.



- 3. Act as a clearinghouse of information for academic institutions, educators, government officials, persons who make public policy, employers and members of the general public on matters relevant to Latinos in this state.
- 4. Perform any other duties prescribed or approved by the Board of Regents.
- Sec. 4. The Board of Regents, on behalf of the Institute for Latino Research and Advocacy, may:
- 1. Enter into contracts with persons or governmental agencies who wish to use the services or facilities of the Institute for Latino Research and Advocacy.
 - 2. Accept gifts or grants of money or property.

- 3. Receive and hold any real or personal property, including patents, copyrights, royalties and contracts.
- 4. Manage, invest, use and dispose of any property received, either as specified by the donor or for the furtherance of the objectives of the Institute for Latino Research and Advocacy.
- Sec. 5. The Board of Regents may establish policies and procedures for personnel in connection with the operation of contractual or sponsored activities of the Institute for Latino Research and Advocacy, apart from those policies and procedures which are established for the professional personnel of other branches or facilities of the System.
- Sec. 6. Any money received by the Board of Regents on behalf of the Institute for Latino Research and Advocacy pursuant to section 4 of this act may be deposited by the Board of Regents to the credit of the Institute for Latino Research and Advocacy in any financial institution in the State of Nevada that is federally insured or insured by a private insurer approved pursuant to NRS 678.755. The Board of Regents may act through any authorized agent in depositing or withdrawing any money in such an account.
- Sec. 7. The Board of Regents may establish fiscal policies and procedures in connection with the operation of contractual or sponsored activities of the Institute for Latino Research and Advocacy, apart from those fiscal policies and procedures which are applicable to other branches or facilities of the System.
 - **Sec. 8.** This act becomes effective on July 1, 2003.
