- 2 played a vital role in the growth of this great country; and
- 3 WHEREAS, Automobile sales in the United States have grown
- 4 over the years from \$4,100 in 1900 to \$3.7 million in 1925, \$6.7
- 5 million in 1950, \$9.3 million in 1965 to over \$140 billion worth of
- 6 motor vehicles and parts produced in the United States by
- 7 companies employing over 6.6 million workers nationwide; and

2 largest purchasers of many key American industrial products, such
3 as steel; and

4 WHEREAS, Since 1987, the automobile industry has grown by
5 more than 47 percent, helping to drive the economy of the United
6 States to new heights; and

8 the past 100 years more than any other invention by allowing
9 consumers to commute long distances for family visits, tourism,
10 entertainment, shopping and work; and
