Senate Bill No. 51—AN ACT relating to energy; establishing a Solar Hot Water Pilot Project to assist certain low-income households in acquiring and installing solar hot water heating systems for the purposes of energy conservation, weatherization and energy efficiency; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Senator Titus moved that the bill be referred to the Committee on Commerce and Labor.

Senate Bill No. 52—AN ACT relating to local governments; authorizing the board of county commissioners of a county and the governing body of a city to designate persons who are charged with the enforcement of county or city ordinances to prepare, sign and serve written citations for violations of county or city ordinances in their jurisdiction; increasing the amount that the governing body of a city is authorized to impose as a civil penalty for a violation of a city ordinance; revising the provisions governing the authority of the governing body of a city to abate certain conditions on private property; authorizing persons charged with the enforcement of county or city

ordinances to remove abandoned vehicles from public property in their jurisdiction; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Senator Townsend moved that the bill be referred to the Committee on Government Affairs.
