SUMMARY—Requires collection and reporting of certain information concerning employers of applicants for Medicaid or Children's Health Insurance Program. (BDR 38-984)

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EXPLANATION – Matter in ***bolded italics*** is new; matter between brackets **[omitted material]** is material to be omitted.

AN ACT relating to public welfare; requiring that an application for Medicaid or the Children's Health Insurance Program include certain information relating to the employer of the applicant or the employer of a person who claims the applicant as a dependent; requiring the biennial reporting by the Department of Human Resources of such information with respect to certain employers and the cost to the State of providing assistance to such applicants; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Legislative Counsel's Digest:

1 Existing law requires the Department of Human Resources to administer all
2 state public welfare programs, including Medicaid and the Children's Health
3 Insurance Program. (NRS 422.270)

4 This bill requires each applicant for Medicaid or the Children's Health
5 Insurance Program to disclose the name and business address of his employer in the
6 application for assistance. If the applicant is the dependent of another person, he
7 must disclose the name and business address of the employer of each person who
8 claims the applicant as a dependent.

9 This bill requires the Department of Human Resources to prepare biennial
10 reports for submission to the Governor and to the Legislature. The reports must



11 include: (1) a listing of the 25 employers that were identified in the applications for
12 assistance as employing the greatest number of employees who received assistance
13 for themselves or for their dependents; and (2) the cost to the State of providing
14 such assistance. The reports must be made available for public inspection, but must
15 not include identifying information related to any particular applicant for or
16 recipient of assistance.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN
SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 **Section 1.** Chapter 422 of NRS is hereby amended by adding
2 thereto a new section to read as follows:

3 ***1. Each application for Medicaid or the Children's Health
4 Insurance Program must include:***

5 ***(a) If the applicant is employed at the time the application is
6 made, the name and business address of each of his employers.***

7 ***(b) If the applicant is the dependent of another person at the
8 time the application is made, the name and business address of
9 each employer of every person who claims the applicant as a
10 dependent.***

11 ***2. The Department shall, on or before January 31 of each
12 odd-numbered year, based on the information provided pursuant
13 to subsection 1, prepare and submit to the Governor and to the
14 Director of the Legislative Counsel Bureau for transmittal to the
15 Legislature a report listing the 25 employers identified pursuant to
16 subsection 1 that, during the immediately preceding 2 calendar
17 years, employed the greatest number of employees in this State
18 who received, or provided financial support for a dependent who
19 received, assistance under Medicaid or the Children's Health
20 Insurance Program. The report must include the following
21 information for each such employer:***

22 ***(a) The name and business address of the employer;***

23 ***(b) The total number of its employees and dependents of its
24 employees who received assistance under Medicaid or the
25 Children's Health Insurance Program during the immediately
preceding 2 calendar years; and***

26 ***(c) The cost to the State of providing such assistance.***

27 ***3. The report required by subsection 2 must include only
28 aggregate information for statistical purposes and exclude any
29 identifying information related to any particular applicant for or
30 recipient of assistance under Medicaid or the Children's Health
31 Insurance Program.***

32 ***4. The report required by subsection 2 is a public record and
33 must be open for inspection pursuant to NRS 239.010.***
