AN ACT relating to wildlife; expanding the number of members who may be appointed to the county advisory board to manage wildlife in larger counties; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Legislative Counsel's Digest:

1 Existing law requires the board of county commissioners of each county to
2 appoint three or five members to the county advisory board to manage wildlife.
3 (NRS 501.260)

4 This bill gives the board of county commissioners in any county whose
5 population is 400,000 or more (currently only Clark County) the additional option
6 of appointing seven members to the county advisory board to manage wildlife.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN
SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

- 1 **Section 1.** NRS 501.260 is hereby amended to read as follows:
2 501.260 1. There is hereby created a county advisory board
3 to manage wildlife in each of the several counties.
4 2. **[Each] In a county whose population:**

1 (a) *Is less than 400,000, each* board consists of three or five
2 members, at the discretion of the board of county commissioners.

3 (b) *Is 400,000 or more, each board consists of three, five or*
4 *seven members, at the discretion of the board of county*
5 *commissioners.*

6 3. A chairman and vice chairman must be selected by each
7 board.
