AN ACT relating to attorneys; repealing the requirement that an attorney, other than a public defender or deputy public defender, appointed to represent an indigent defendant report to the State Public Defender concerning such representation; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Legislative Counsel's Digest:

- 1 Existing law requires an attorney, other than a public defender or deputy public
2 defender, who is appointed to represent an indigent defendant to report to the State
3 Public Defender regarding the representation. (NRS 180.070)

- 1 **Section 1.** NRS 180.070 is hereby repealed.
2 **Sec. 2.** This act becomes effective upon passage and approval.

TEXT OF REPEALED SECTION

180.070 Reports from other attorneys appointed to represent indigents required. Any attorney other than a public defender or deputy public defender who is appointed to represent an indigent shall report to the State Public Defender concerning his representation in a form prescribed by the State Public Defender.
