**SUMMARY**—Revises membership of State Environmental Commission. (BDR 40-661)

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**AN ACT** relating to the State Environmental Commission; revising the membership of the Commission; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

**Legislative Counsel's Digest:**

1 Existing law creates the State Environmental Commission within the State  
2 Department of Conservation and Natural Resources. (NRS 445B.200) The State  
3 Environmental Commission consists of six members designated by statute,  
4 including the State Forester Firewarden, and five persons appointed by the  
5 Governor. (NRS 445B.200)

6 This bill removes the State Forester Firewarden as a member of the State  
7 Environmental Commission and increases the number of members to be appointed  
8 by the Governor to six. This bill further provides that one member who is appointed  
9 by the Governor must have experience and expertise in advocating issues relating  
10 to conservation.

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THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN  
SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1       **Section 1.** NRS 445B.200 is hereby amended to read as  
2 follows:

3       445B.200 1. The State Environmental Commission is hereby  
4 created within the ~~State Department of Conservation and Natural  
5 Resources, ] Department.~~ The Commission consists of:

6       (a) The Director of the Department of Wildlife;

7       (b) ~~The State Forester Firewarden;~~

8       ~~(c)~~ The State Engineer;

9       ~~(d)~~ (c) The Director of the State Department of Agriculture;

10      ~~(e)~~ (d) The Administrator of the Division of Minerals of the  
11 Commission on Mineral Resources;

12      ~~(f)~~ (e) A member of the State Board of Health to be designated  
13 by that Board; and

14      ~~(g)~~ Five]

15      (f) Six members appointed by the Governor, one of whom is a  
16 general engineering contractor or a general building contractor  
17 licensed pursuant to chapter 624 of NRS , ~~and~~ one of whom  
18 possesses expertise in performing mining reclamation ~~and one of~~  
19 *whom possesses experience and expertise in advocating issues*  
20 *relating to conservation.*

21      2. The Governor shall appoint the Chairman of the  
22 Commission from among the members of the Commission.

23      3. A majority of the members constitutes a quorum, and a  
24 majority of those present must concur in any decision.

25      4. Each member who is appointed by the Governor is entitled  
26 to receive a salary of not more than \$80, as fixed by the  
27 Commission, for each day's attendance at a meeting of the  
28 Commission.

29      5. While engaged in the business of the Commission, each  
30 member and employee of the Commission is entitled to receive the  
31 per diem allowance and travel expenses provided for state officers  
32 and employees generally.

33      6. Any person who receives or has received during the  
34 previous 2 years a significant portion of his income, as defined by  
35 any applicable state or federal law, directly or indirectly from one or  
36 more holders of or applicants for a permit required by NRS  
37 445A.300 to 445A.730, inclusive, is disqualified from serving as a  
38 member of the Commission. The provisions of this subsection do  
39 not apply to any person who receives or has received during the  
40 previous 2 years, a significant portion of his income from any  
41 department or agency of state government which is a holder of or an



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1 applicant for a permit required by NRS 445A.300 to 445A.730,  
2 inclusive.

3       7. The ~~State Department of Conservation and Natural~~  
4 ~~Resources~~ **Department** shall provide technical advice, support and  
5 assistance to the Commission. All state officers, departments,  
6 commissions and agencies, including the Department of  
7 Transportation, the Department of Human Resources, the University  
8 and Community College System of Nevada, the State Public Works  
9 Board, the Department of Motor Vehicles, the Department of Public  
10 Safety, the Public Utilities Commission of Nevada, the  
11 Transportation Services Authority and the State Department of  
12 Agriculture may also provide technical advice, support and  
13 assistance to the Commission.

14     **Sec. 2.** 1. Notwithstanding the amendatory provisions of  
15 section 1 of this act, the State Forester Firewarden shall continue to  
16 serve as a member of the State Environmental Commission until the  
17 Governor appoints a member to the Commission pursuant to  
18 subsection 2.

19     2. As soon as practicable after July 1, 2005, the Governor shall  
20 appoint to the State Environmental Commission a person who is  
21 qualified to serve as a member of the Commission in accordance  
22 with the provisions of paragraph (f) of subsection 1 of NRS  
23 445B.200, as amended by section 1 of this act.

24     **Sec. 3.** This act becomes effective on July 1, 2005.

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
