

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 280—ASSEMBLYMEN GIUNCHIGLIANI,
CONKLIN, DENIS, HOGAN, HORNE, KOIVISTO AND OHRENSCHALL

MARCH 21, 2005

Referred to Committee on Education

SUMMARY—Revises provisions regarding University and Community College System of Nevada.
(BDR 34-85)

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EXPLANATION – Matter in ***bolded italics*** is new; matter between brackets **[omitted material]** is material to be omitted.

AN ACT relating higher education; requiring the Board of Regents of the University of Nevada to ensure that students enrolled in a program for the education of teachers are instructed in the academic standards required for high school pupils; requiring access to library facilities for students enrolled at an institution within the University and Community College System of Nevada; specifying that a student at a university or state college within the System completes a full course of study for the issuance of a diploma of graduation from the System if he satisfies the requirements for graduation and a degree as set forth in the catalog of the university or state college that is in effect at the time of enrollment or at the time of graduation, whichever the student elects; revising the terms of office of members of the Board of Regents; revising provisions regarding the degrees and transferability of credits earned within the System; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Legislative Counsel's Digest:

- 1 Existing law provides for the establishment of courses of study and academic standards for the public schools in this State. (Chapter 389 of NRS)
- 2 This bill requires the Board of Regents of the University of Nevada to work with the State Board of Education and the Council to Establish Academic Standards



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5 for Public Schools to ensure that students enrolled in a program for the education of
6 teachers are provided instruction in the standards for high school pupils.

7 Existing law sets forth the requirements for issuance of a baccalaureate degree
8 by the Board of Regents. (NRS 396.560)

9 This bill specifies the manner in which a student is determined to have
10 completed a full course of study for the issuance of a diploma of graduation from
11 the System.

12 Existing law prescribes 6-year terms of office for the members of the Board of
13 Regents. (NRS 396.040)

14 This bill reduces the terms of office to 4 years. The current members elected
15 will continue to serve out their 6-year terms of office. This provision becomes
16 effective only if AJR 11 of the 72nd Session of the Nevada Legislature is not
17 passed by the 73rd Session of the Legislature.

18 Existing law requires that all credits earned at a community college within the
19 System be transferable to a university or state college within the System if the
20 course catalog identifies the course by the same title and description.
21 (NRS 396.568)

22 This bill requires that all courses earned at a community college within the
23 System automatically transfer to a university or state college within the System and
24 removes the requirements regarding the course catalog.

25 This bill also provides that a student who has been awarded an associate's
26 degree must be enrolled as a junior if he enrolls in any institution within the
27 System. This bill further provides that a student enrolled at any campus of the
28 System must be granted access to library facilities available within the System and
29 must be adequately informed of those facilities.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN
SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 **Section 1.** Chapter 396 of NRS is hereby amended by adding
2 thereto the provisions set forth as sections 2 to 5, inclusive, of this
3 act.

4 **Sec. 2.** *The Legislature hereby encourages the Board of
5 Regents to review periodically their mission for higher education,
6 as the number of institutions within the System expands and the
7 focus of each institution is defined and further redefined, to
8 determine whether there is unnecessary duplication of programs
9 or courses within the System which might be more appropriate for
10 a different institution. The System is encouraged to review the
11 core curriculum at each institution to determine whether there is
12 parity among the institutions of the System.*

13 **Sec. 3.** *The Board of Regents shall, in cooperation with the
14 State Board and the Council to Establish Academic Standards for
15 Public Schools, ensure that students enrolled in a program
16 developed by the System for the education of teachers are provided
17 instruction regarding the standards of content and performance
18 required of pupils enrolled in high schools in this State.*

19 **Sec. 4.** (Deleted by amendment.)



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1 **Sec. 5. A student who is enrolled in a university, state college
2 or community college within the System must be granted access to
3 all the library facilities that are available to students enrolled in
4 any of the institutions within the System and must be adequately
5 informed of the library services that are available.**

6 **Sec. 6. NRS 396.040 is hereby amended to read as follows:**

7 396.040 1. The Board of Regents consists of 13 members
8 elected by the registered voters within the districts described in NRS
9 396.0415 to 396.046, inclusive.

10 2. The members of the Board of Regents must be elected as
11 follows:

12 (a) At the general election in ~~2002,~~ 2008, and every ~~6~~ 4 years
13 thereafter, one member of the Board of Regents must be elected
14 from districts 2, 3, 5 and 10.

15 (b) At the general election in ~~2004,~~ 2010, and every ~~6~~ 4 years
16 thereafter, one member of the Board of Regents must be elected
17 from districts 6, 7, 8, 11 and 13.

18 (c) At the general election in 2006, and every ~~6~~ 4 years
19 thereafter, one member of the Board of Regents must be elected
20 from districts 1, 4, 9 and 12.

21 3. Each member of the Board of Regents must be a resident of
22 the district from which he is elected.

23 **Sec. 7. NRS 396.560 is hereby amended to read as follows:**

24 396.560 1. Upon the recommendation of a president of a
25 branch within the System, the Board of Regents shall issue to those
26 who worthily complete the full course of study in the school of
27 mines or in the school of agriculture, or in the school of liberal arts,
28 or in any equivalent course that may hereafter be prescribed, a
29 diploma of graduation, conferring the proper academic degree, from
30 the System.

31 2. The Board of Regents shall not issue such a diploma to a
32 ~~person~~ student who has not completed the full course of study as
33 set forth in ~~subsection 1.~~ this section.

34 3. *For the purposes of this section, a student at a university or
35 state college within the System completes the full course of study
36 for a diploma of graduation if, in accordance with the policy of the
37 Board of Regents, he satisfies the requirements for graduation and
38 a degree as set forth in the catalog of the university or state college
39 that is in effect at the time the student:*

40 (a) *First enrolls in the university or state college or is admitted
41 to the academic program or department of the student's major if
42 the program or department has a formal process for admitting
43 students to the program or department; or*

44 (b) *Graduates,*



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1 ➔ whichever the student elects. A student who changes his major
2 must elect the catalog of the year of the latest change of the major
3 or the year of graduation. A student may not elect a catalog that is
4 more than 10 years old at the time of his graduation.

5 Sec. 8. NRS 396.568 is hereby amended to read as follows:

6 396.568 ~~In accordance with the policy of the Board of~~
7 ~~Regents, all]~~

8 1. All credits earned by a student in a course at a community
9 college within the System, including, without limitation, all credits
10 earned in a course toward the award of an associate's degree ~~t,~~
11 ~~including, without limitation, a degree of associate in applied~~
12 ~~sciencee, must be accepted and applied] must automatically transfer~~
13 toward the course work required of the student in his major or
14 minor, or other course work required of the student, for the award of
15 a baccalaureate degree upon graduation of the student from any
16 university or state college within the System. ~~If the catalog for the~~
17 ~~community college:~~

18 ~~1. Designates the course as transferable by the System;~~
19 ~~2. Identifies the course by the same title as the equivalent~~
20 ~~required course offered at a university or state college, as applicable;~~
21 ~~and~~
22 ~~3. Contains the same description for the course as the~~
23 ~~equivalent required course offered at a university or state college, as~~
24 ~~applicable.]~~

25 2. Pursuant to the policy of the Board of Regents, a student
26 who is awarded an associate's degree:

27 (a) Shall be deemed to have completed the course of study
28 required of a sophomore.

29 (b) If he enrolls in another institution within the System, must
30 be enrolled as a junior.

31 3. All credits earned toward the completion of a degree of
32 associate of arts, associate of science or associate of business must
33 automatically transfer toward the course work required for the
34 award of a baccalaureate degree upon the graduation of the
35 student from any university or college within the System.

36 ➔ If the transfer of credit pursuant to this section is denied and
37 the student believes that the credit should be applied to his degree,
38 he may appeal the decision. The appeal process must be made
39 available to all students and may be posted on the website of the
40 System.

41 Sec. 9. If section 6 of this act becomes effective, the members
42 of the Board of Regents of the University of Nevada who are in
43 office on July 1, 2005, shall serve out the term of office for which
44 they were elected.



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1 **Sec. 10.** If a committee related to higher education is created
2 by the Legislature, that committee is encouraged to participate in
3 any review conducted by the Board of Regents of the University of
4 Nevada pursuant to section 2 of this act and to report back to the
5 Legislature on the status of the review.

6 **Sec. 11.** 1. This section and sections 1 to 5, inclusive, 8, 9
7 and 10 of this act become effective upon passage and approval.

8 2. Section 7 of this act becomes effective on July 1, 2005.

9 3. Section 6 of this act becomes effective only if Assembly
10 Joint Resolution No. 11 of the 72nd Session of the Nevada
11 Legislature is not passed by the 73rd Session of the Nevada
12 Legislature.

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
