

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 281—ASSEMBLYMAN HOLCOMB

MARCH 21, 2005

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Referred to Committee on Judiciary

SUMMARY—Makes various changes concerning damages awarded in civil actions. (BDR 3-1129)

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AN ACT relating to tort actions; limiting the amount of noneconomic damages that may be awarded in certain civil actions; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1       **Section 1.** Chapter 42 of NRS is hereby amended by adding  
2 thereto a new section to read as follows:

3       *1. In an action for damages for personal injury or wrongful  
4 death, the trier of fact shall itemize, in the verdict, the award of  
5 damages to reflect the monetary amount intended for:*

- 6       *(a) Past expenses for medical treatment, care or custody;  
7       (b) Future expenses for medical treatment, care or custody;  
8       (c) Past loss of earnings;  
9       (d) Future loss of earnings;  
10      (e) Noneconomic damages; and  
11      (f) Other damages.*

12       *2. Except as otherwise provided in this section and NRS  
13 41.035 and 41.503, in an action for damages for personal injury or  
14 wrongf ul death, a judgment for noneconomic damages must not  
15 exceed \$250,000.*

16       *3. If the action is tried before a jury, the court or a party to  
17 the action shall not instruct or otherwise advise the jury*

1    *concerning the limitation on noneconomic damages set forth in*  
2    *subsection 2.*

3    *4. The limitation on noneconomic damages set forth in*  
4    *subsection 2 does not apply to a cause of action that arises from:*

- 5    *(a) Willful or reckless misconduct;*
- 6    *(b) An act or omission that constitutes a felony; or*
- 7    *(c) Medical or dental malpractice.*

8    *5. This section applies to an act, error or omission occurring*  
9    *on or after October 1, 2005, that allegedly caused the personal*  
10    *injury or wrongful death.*

11    *6. As used in this section, “noneconomic damages” includes,*  
12    *without limitation, damages to compensate for pain, suffering,*  
13    *inconvenience, physical impairment, disfigurement or other*  
14    *nonpecuniary damages.*
