

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 289—ASSEMBLYMAN MORTENSON

MARCH 21, 2005

Referred to Committee on Natural Resources,
Agriculture, and Mining

SUMMARY—Requires Administrator of Office of Historic Preservation of Department of Cultural Affairs to establish stewardship program for protection of cultural resources. (BDR 33-554)

AN ACT relating to cultural resources; requiring the Administrator of the Office of Historic Preservation of the Department of Cultural Affairs to establish a stewardship program for the protection of cultural resources; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Legislative Counsel's Digest:

Under existing law, the Office of Historic Preservation of the Department of Cultural Affairs protects prehistoric and historic sites, including Indian burial sites. (Chapters 381 and 383 of NRS)

This bill requires the Administrator of the Office of Historic Preservation to establish a stewardship program for cultural resources located on public land in Nevada, including objects, sites or information of historic, prehistoric, archeological, architectural or paleontological significance. The Administrator must select, train and certify unpaid volunteers to serve in the stewardship program. The Administrator must coordinate with federal, state and local governmental agencies, Native American tribes and private industry to carry out the program. The Administrator and the Office must provide administrative services to assist in carrying out the program.

The stewardship program is authorized to: (1) submit to the Administrator a list of cultural resource sites to be monitored; (2) schedule periodic monitoring activities for cultural resources included on the list; (3) establish requirements for reporting damage or threats of damage to cultural resources; and (4) establish programs for educating the public concerning the significance and value of cultural resources and the loss to the public resulting from damage to those resources.



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THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN
SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 **Section 1.** Chapter 383 of NRS is hereby amended by adding
2 thereto a new section to read as follows:

3 **1. The Administrator shall, by regulation, establish a
4 stewardship program to:**

5 **(a) Protect cultural resources located on public land in this
6 State;**

7 **(b) Increase public awareness of the significance and value of
8 cultural resources and the damage done to cultural resources by
9 an act of vandalism;**

10 **(c) Discourage acts of vandalism and the unlawful sale and
11 trade of artifacts, including, without limitation, archeological and
12 paleontological materials;**

13 **(d) Support and encourage improved standards for
14 investigating and researching cultural resources in this State;**

15 **(e) Promote cooperation among governmental agencies,
16 organizations, private industries, Native American tribes and
17 persons who wish to protect cultural resources and enter into
18 agreements with those agencies, organizations, private industries,
19 Native American tribes and persons to promote the protection of
20 cultural resources; and**

21 **(f) Increase the inventory of cultural resources maintained
22 pursuant to NRS 383.021.**

23 **2. The Administrator shall select, train and certify volunteers
24 to serve in the stewardship program based upon the requirements
25 established by the Administrator.**

26 **3. The stewardship program may:**

27 **(a) In cooperation with governmental agencies, organizations,
28 private industries, Native American tribes and persons specified in
29 paragraph (e) of subsection 1, submit a proposed list to the
30 Administrator for his approval setting forth any sites that are or
31 may include cultural resources located on public land in this
32 State;**

33 **(b) Schedule periodic monitoring activities by volunteers of
34 sites included on the list approved pursuant to paragraph (a);**

35 **(c) Establish requirements for reporting any act of vandalism
36 to appropriate authorities as determined by the Administrator; and**

37 **(d) Establish programs for educating the members of the
38 public concerning the significance and value of cultural resources
39 and the loss to the members of the public resulting from damage to
40 cultural resources.**

41 **4. The Administrator shall coordinate the activities of federal
42 agencies, private industries, Native American tribes and state and**



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1 local governmental agencies, as necessary, to carry out the
2 stewardship program.

3 5. The Administrator and the Office shall provide
4 administrative services to assist in carrying out the stewardship
5 program.

6 6. Volunteers selected for the stewardship program serve
7 without compensation and are not entitled to receive any per diem
8 allowance or travel expenses.

9 7. The Administrator may accept gifts, grants, donations or
10 contributions from any source to assist him in carrying out the
11 stewardship program.

12 8. As used in this section, "act of vandalism" means to
13 damage, destroy or commit or threaten to commit any other act
14 that defaces or harms any cultural resources without the consent
15 of the owner or appropriate governmental agency, including,
16 without limitation, inscribing, marking, etching, scratching,
17 drawing, painting on or affixing to the cultural resources any
18 mark, figure or design.

19 Sec. 2. NRS 383.011 is hereby amended to read as follows:

20 383.011 As used in this chapter, unless the context otherwise
21 requires:

22 1. "Administrator" means the Administrator of the Office.

23 2. "Advisory Board" means the Board of Museums and
24 History.

25 3. "*Cultural resources*" means any objects, sites or
26 information of historic, prehistoric, archeological, architectural or
27 paleontological significance.

28 4. "Director" means the Director of the Department of Cultural
29 Affairs.

30 5. "Office" means the Office of Historic Preservation of
31 the Department of Cultural Affairs.

32 Sec. 3. NRS 383.021 is hereby amended to read as follows:

33 383.021 1. The Office of Historic Preservation is hereby
34 created.

35 2. The Office shall:

36 (a) Encourage, plan and coordinate historic preservation and
37 archeological activities within the State, including programs to
38 survey, record, study and preserve or salvage ~~objects, localities and~~
39 ~~information of historic, prehistoric and paleoenvironmental~~
40 ~~significance.] cultural resources.~~

41 (b) Compile and maintain an inventory of ~~historic,~~
42 ~~archeological and architectural]~~ *cultural* resources in Nevada
43 deemed significant by the Administrator.

44 (c) Designate repositories for the materials that comprise the
45 inventory.



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1 3. The Comstock Historic District Commission is within the
2 Office.
3 **Sec. 4.** This act becomes effective on July 1, 2005.

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
