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ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 334—ASSEMBLYWOMAN BUCKLEY

SUMMARY—Provides for protection of social security numbers and certain other personal information. (BDR 19-874)

FISCAL NOTE: Effect on Local Government: Increases or Newly Provides for Term of Imprisonment in County or City Jail or Detention Facility.  
Effect on the State: Yes.

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EXPLANATION – Matter in *bolded italics* is new; matter between brackets ~~omitted material~~ is material to be omitted.

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AN ACT relating to privacy; requiring a governmental entity, except in certain circumstances, to ensure that social security numbers in its books and records are maintained in a confidential manner; requiring a governmental agency or person who does business in this State that owns, licenses or maintains computerized data to notify certain persons if personal information included in that data was, or is reasonably believed to have been, acquired by an unauthorized person; expanding the types of prohibited computer contaminants to include spyware; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

- 1     **Section 1.** Chapter 239 of NRS is hereby amended by adding  
2     thereto a new section to read as follows:  
3     *Except as otherwise required to carry out a specific statute, a*  
4     *governmental agency shall ensure that the social security number*  
5     *of a person in its books and records is maintained in a confidential*  
6     *manner.*



1       **Sec. 2.** Chapter 239B of NRS is hereby amended by adding  
2 thereto a new section to read as follows:

3       1. *Except as otherwise provided in subsection 4, upon*  
4 *discovery of any breach of the security of any of its computer*  
5 *systems, a governmental agency that:*

6       (a) *Owns or licenses computerized data that includes personal*  
7 *information shall notify, in the manner set forth in subsection 2,*  
8 *any resident of this State whose personal information included in*  
9 *that data was, or is reasonably believed to have been, acquired by*  
10 *an unauthorized person.*

11       (b) *Maintains computerized data that includes personal*  
12 *information that the governmental agency does not own shall*  
13 *notify, in the manner set forth in subsection 2, the owner or*  
14 *licensee of the data if the personal information included in that*  
15 *data was, or is reasonably believed to have been, acquired by an*  
16 *unauthorized person.*

17       2. *Except as otherwise provided in subsection 3, the notice*  
18 *required pursuant to subsection 1 must be provided as soon as*  
19 *practicable by:*

20       (a) *Written notice;*

21       (b) *If the notice is consistent with the provisions regarding*  
22 *electronic records and signatures set forth in 15 U.S.C. § 7001,*  
23 *electronic notice; or*

24       (c) *Any other method established by the governmental agency*  
25 *as part of a policy for the security of its computer systems that*  
26 *provides for notification as soon as practicable to the owner or*

35 *of providing the notice by the methods described in subsection 2*  
36 *would be more than \$250,000, the governmental agency may*

38       (a) *If the governmental agency has an electronic mail address*  
39 *for the owner or licensee of the data containing the personal*

43       (b) *If the governmental agency maintains an Internet website,*  
44 *posting the notice in a conspicuous place on its Internet website;*

2 4. *If a law enforcement agency determines that the notice*  
3 *required pursuant to subsection 1 may impede a criminal*  
4 *investigation, the governmental agency shall delay such notice*  
5 *until the law enforcement agency determines that the notice will*  
6 *not compromise the criminal investigation.*

7 5. *A person who has suffered injury as the proximate result*  
8 *of a violation of this section may commence an action against the*  
9 *governmental agency for the recovery of his actual damages, costs*  
10 *and reasonable attorney's fees and for any punitive damages that*  
11 *the facts may warrant. An action described in this subsection must*  
12 *be commenced not later than 2 years after the person who suffered*

2 or sound that is designed or has the capability to prevent, impede,

5 **Sec. 4.** Chapter 603 of NRS is hereby amended by adding  
6 thereto a new section to read as follows:

7 *1. Except as otherwise provided in subsection 4, upon*  
8 *discovery of any breach of the security of his computer system, a*  
9 *person doing business in this State that:*

10 (a) *Owns or licenses computerized data that includes personal*  
11 *information shall notify, in the manner set forth in subsection 2,*  
12 *any resident of this State whose personal information contained in*  
13 *that data was, or is reasonably believed to have been, acquired by*  
14 *an unauthorized person.*

15 (b) *Maintains computerized data that includes personalized*  
16 *information that the person doing business in this State does not*  
17 *own shall notify, in the manner set forth in subsection 2, the*  
18 *owner or licensee of the data if personal information contained in*  
19 *that data was, or is reasonably believed to have been, acquired by*  
20 *an unauthorized person.*

6 ***required pursuant to subsection 1 may impede a criminal***  
7 ***investigation, the person doing business in this State shall delay***  
8 ***such notice until the law enforcement agency determines that the***  
9 ***notice will not compromise the criminal investigation.***

10       ***5. A person who has suffered injury as the proximate result***  
11 ***of a violation of this section may commence an action against the***  
12 ***person doing business in this State for the recovery of his actual***  
13 ***damages, costs and reasonable attorney's fees and for any punitive***  
14 ***damages that the facts may warrant. An action described in this***  
15 ***subsection must be commenced not later than 2 years after the***  
16 ***person who suffered the injury discovers the facts constituting the***  
17 ***violation of this section.***

18       ***6. As used in this section, "personal information" means the***  
19 ***name of a person and one or more of the following types of***  
20 ***information:***

21       ***(a) The social security number of the person.***

22       ***(b) The driver's license number or identification card number***  
23 ***of the person.***
