

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 345—ASSEMBLYMAN PERKINS

MARCH 22, 2005

Referred to Committee on Government Affairs

SUMMARY—Makes various changes relating to Peace Officers’ Standards and Training Commission. (BDR 23-1326)

AN ACT relating to the Peace Officers’ Standards and Training Commission; expanding the membership of the Commission; providing that the Chairman of the Commission may only vote to break ties; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

- 1 **Section 1.** NRS 289.500 is hereby amended to read as follows:
- 2 289.500 1. The Peace Officers’ Standards and Training
- 3 Commission, consisting of ~~seven~~ *eight* members appointed by the
- 4 Governor, is hereby created. The Governor shall appoint:
- 5 (a) ~~One member~~ *Two members* from Clark County ~~;~~, *one of*
- 6 *whom must be from a metropolitan police department created*
- 7 *pursuant to chapter 280 of NRS if one exists in Clark County;*
- 8 (b) One member from Washoe County;
- 9 (c) Two members from counties other than Clark and Washoe
- 10 Counties;
- 11 (d) One member from a state law enforcement agency that
- 12 primarily employs peace officers required to receive training as
- 13 category I peace officers;
- 14 (e) One member who is a category II peace officer; and
- 15 (f) One member who is a category III peace officer.



1 2. Members of the Commission serve terms of 2 years.  
2 Members serve without compensation, but are entitled to the per  
3 diem allowance and travel expenses provided by law for state  
4 officers and employees generally.

5 3. The Governor shall make the appointments to the  
6 Commission from recommendations submitted by Clark County,  
7 Washoe County, professional organizations of sheriffs and police  
8 chiefs of this State and employee organizations that represent only  
9 peace officers of this State who are certified by the Commission.

10 **Sec. 2.** NRS 289.510 is hereby amended to read as follows:

11 289.510 1. The Commission:

12 (a) Shall meet at the call of the Chairman, who must be elected  
13 by a majority vote of the members of the Commission. *The*  
14 *Chairman may only vote on a matter if necessary to break a tie*  
15 *vote among the other members of the Commission.*

16 (b) Shall provide for and encourage the training and education  
17 of persons whose primary duty is law enforcement to ensure the  
18 safety of the residents of and visitors to this State.

19 (c) Shall adopt regulations establishing minimum standards for  
20 the certification and decertification, recruitment, selection and  
21 training of peace officers. The regulations must establish:

22 (1) Requirements for basic training for category I, category II  
23 and category III peace officers and reserve peace officers;

24 (2) Standards for programs for the continuing education of  
25 peace officers, including minimum courses of study and  
26 requirements concerning attendance;

27 (3) Qualifications for instructors of peace officers; and

28 (4) Requirements for the certification of a course of training.

29 (d) Shall, when necessary, present courses of training and  
30 continuing education courses for category I, category II and  
31 category III peace officers and reserve peace officers.

32 (e) May make necessary inquiries to determine whether the  
33 agencies of this State and of the local governments are complying  
34 with standards set forth in its regulations.

35 (f) Shall carry out the duties required of the Commission  
36 pursuant to NRS 432B.610 and 432B.620.

37 (g) May perform any other acts that may be necessary and  
38 appropriate to the functions of the Commission as set forth in NRS  
39 289.450 to 289.600, inclusive.

40 (h) May enter into an interlocal agreement with an Indian tribe  
41 to provide training to and certification of persons employed as  
42 police officers by that Indian tribe.

43 2. Regulations adopted by the Commission:

44 (a) Apply to all agencies of this State and of local governments  
45 in this State that employ persons as peace officers;



1 (b) Must require that all peace officers receive training in the  
2 handling of cases involving abuse or neglect of children or missing  
3 children; and

4 (c) May require that training be carried on at institutions which  
5 it approves in those regulations.

6 **Sec. 3.** Notwithstanding the provisions of subsection 2 of NRS  
7 289.500, the Governor shall appoint the additional member added to  
8 the Peace Officers' Standards and Training Commission pursuant to  
9 section 1 of this act to an initial term ending on July 1, 2006.

10 **Sec. 4.** This act becomes effective on July 1, 2005.
