

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 395—ASSEMBLYWOMAN GIUNCHIGLIANI

MARCH 24, 2005

Referred to Committee on Education

SUMMARY—Prohibits use of false or misleading degrees.
(BDR 34-125)

AN ACT relating to education; prohibiting the use or attempted use of a false or misleading degree or honorary degree granted by a private entity or public postsecondary educational institution and the use or attempted use of a degree or honorary degree granted by such an entity or institution in a false or misleading manner; providing a penalty; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN
SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 **Section 1.** Chapter 394 of NRS is hereby amended by adding
2 thereto a new section to read as follows:

3 ***1. It is unlawful for a person knowingly to use or attempt to***
use:

5 ***(a) A false or misleading degree or honorary degree conferred***
6 ***by a private entity, regardless of whether that entity is located in***
7 ***this State and regardless of whether that entity is authorized to***
8 ***operate in this State; or***

9 ***(b) A degree or honorary degree conferred by a private entity***
10 ***in a false or misleading manner, regardless of whether that entity***
11 ***is located in this State and regardless of whether that entity is***
12 ***authorized to operate in this State,***



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1 ➔ in connection with admission to any institution of higher
2 education or in connection with any business, employment,
3 occupation, profession, trade or public office.

4 2. Unless a greater penalty is provided by specific statute, a
5 person who violates the provisions of this section is guilty of a
6 gross misdemeanor.

7 3. For the purposes of this section, a degree or honorary
8 degree is false or misleading or is used in a false or misleading
9 manner if it:

10 (a) States or suggests that the person named in the degree or
11 honorary degree has completed the requirements of an academic
12 or professional program of study in a particular field of endeavor
13 beyond the secondary school level and the person has not, in fact,
14 completed the requirements of the program of study;

15 (b) Is offered as his own by a person other than the person
16 who completed the requirements of the program of study; or

17 (c) Is awarded, bestowed, conferred, given, granted, conveyed
18 or sold:

19 (1) Based upon more than 10 percent of the recipient's
20 documented life experience and not based upon actual completion
21 of academic work;

22 (2) By a person or entity located in this State in violation of
23 this chapter, as determined by the Commission; or

24 (3) By a person or entity located outside this State which
25 would be a violation of this chapter if the person or entity were
26 located in this State, as determined by the Commission.

27 4. As used in this section:

28 (a) "Degree" has the meaning ascribed to it in NRS 394.620.

29 (b) "Honorary degree" has the meaning ascribed to it in
30 NRS 394.620.

31 Sec. 2. NRS 394.125 is hereby amended to read as follows:

32 394.125 It is the policy of this State to encourage and enable its
33 [citizens] residents to receive an education commensurate with their
34 respective talents and desires. The Legislature recognizes that
35 privately owned institutions offering elementary, secondary and
36 postsecondary education and vocational and professional instruction
37 perform a necessary service to the [citizens] residents of this State.
38 It is the purpose of this chapter to provide for the protection,
39 education and welfare of the [citizens] residents of the State of
40 Nevada, its educational, vocational and professional institutions, and
41 its students, by:

42 1. Establishing minimum standards concerning quality of
43 education, ethical and business practices, health and safety, and
44 fiscal responsibility, to protect against substandard, transient,
45 unethical, deceptive or fraudulent institutions and practices;



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1 2. Prohibiting the granting of false or misleading educational
2 credentials;

3 3. ***Prohibiting the use or attempted use of false or misleading
4 degrees and honorary degrees and the use or attempted use of
5 degrees and honorary degrees in a false or misleading manner;***

6 4. Regulating the use of academic terminology in naming or
7 otherwise designating educational institutions;

8 ~~4.~~ 5. Prohibiting misleading literature, advertising,
9 solicitation or representation by educational institutions or their
10 agents;

11 ~~5.~~ 6. Providing for the preservation of essential academic
12 records; and

13 ~~6.~~ 7. Providing certain rights and remedies to the consuming
14 public and the Commission and the Board necessary to effectuate
15 the purposes of this chapter.

16 **Sec. 3.** Chapter 396 of NRS is hereby amended by adding
17 thereto a new section to read as follows:

22 institution, regardless of whether that institution is located in this

26 another public postsecondary educational institution in a false or
27 misleading manner, regardless of whether that institution is
28 located in this State and regardless of whether that institution is
29 authorized to operate in this State,***

11 Sec. 4. NRS 205.420 is hereby amended to read as follows:

12 205.420 Every person who ~~shall conduct~~ conducts any
13 business or ~~perform~~ performs any act under color of, or file for
14 record with any public officer, any false or fraudulent permit,
15 license ~~, diploma~~ or writing, or any permit, license ~~, diploma~~ or
16 writing not lawfully belonging to such person, or who ~~shall obtain~~
17 obtains any permit, license ~~, diploma~~ or writing by color or aid of
18 any false representation, pretense, personation, token or writing ~~,~~
19 ~~shall be~~ is guilty of a gross misdemeanor.

20 Sec. 5. This act becomes effective on July 1, 2005.

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
