AN ACT relating to the State Legislature; extending the date for expiration of the Legislative Committee on Taxation, Public Revenue and Tax Policy; directing the Committee to study the franchise fees, business license fees and all other fees and taxes imposed upon providers of telecommunication, video, data, electric and natural gas services; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 **Section 1.** NRS 218.53745 is hereby amended to read as
2 follows:

6 ***(a) Analyze the effect of changes in technology on the fees
7 administered and imposed by the state and local governments on***

3 (b) Monitor the effect of any changes proposed by the Federal
4 Communications Commission and the Congress of the United
5 States to the categorization of different types of telecommunication
6 and video services and the jurisdiction, or lack thereof, of the state
7 and local governments over those services.

8 (c) Analyze and compare the procedures and methods used by
9 local governments to administer, tax and limit the use of public
10 rights-of-way by the providers of telecommunications, video, data,
11 electric or natural gas services.

12 (d) Consider individually telecommunications, video, data,
13 electric and natural gas services to determine the most appropriate
14 level of government for administering taxes and fees on such
15 services.

16 (e) Analyze any services or benefits that are currently offered
17 to providers of telecommunications, video, data, electric or natural
18 gas services by local governments in exchange for the franchise
19 fees charged by local governments.

20 (f) Examine and consider the proposed effects of eliminating
21 franchise fees, business license fees and all other fees and taxes
22 imposed upon providers of telecommunications, video, data,
23 electric and natural gas services.

24 (g) Consider the methods of distribution to local governments
25 of the revenue from the tax on aviation fuel and motor vehicle fuel
26 imposed by or pursuant to chapter 365 of NRS.

27 (h) Review the price and availability of renewable and
28 alternative fuels.

29 (i) Consider any other matter that the Committee determines is
30 relevant to its duties prescribed in this subsection.

31 2. May review and study:

32 (a) The specific taxes collected in this State;

33 (b) The implementation of any taxes, fees and other methods for
34 generating public revenue in this State;

35 (c) The impact of any changes to taxes, fees and other methods
36 for generating public revenue that result from legislation enacted by
37 the Legislature on the residents of this State and on the businesses
38 located in this State, doing business in this State or considering
39 locating in this State;

40 (d) The fiscal effects of any taxes, fees and other methods for
41 generating public revenue;

42 (e) The impact, if any, on the prices charged to the residents of
43 this State from the compounding of various new or increased taxes
44 such as the real property transfer tax;

1 (f) The beneficial and detrimental effects, if any, of the
2 reduction of the tax based on wages for the cost of employee health
3 benefits;

4 (g) Broad issues of tax policy and fiscal policy relevant to the
5 future of the State of Nevada; and

6 (h) Any other issues related to taxation, the generation of public
7 revenue, tax policy or fiscal policy which affect this State.

25 **Sec. 2.** NRS 218.53747 is hereby amended to read as follows:

26 218.53747 If the Committee conducts investigations or holds
27 hearings pursuant to subsection ~~[2]~~ 3 of NRS 218.53745:

28 1. The Secretary of the Committee or, in his absence, a
29 member designated by the Committee may administer oaths; and
30 2. The Secretary or Chairman of the Committee may cause the
31 deposition of witnesses, residing either within or outside of this
32 State, to be taken in the manner prescribed by rule of court for
33 taking depositions in civil actions in the district courts.
