JOINT SPONSORS: SENATORS AMODEI AND CARE

Referred to Committee on Health and Human Services

SUMMARY—Makes certain changes to reporting requirements for sentinel events at medical facilities. (BDR 40-1025)

FISCAL NOTE: Effect on Local Government: May have Fiscal Impact.
Effect on the State: Yes.

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EXPLANATION – Matter in ***bolded italics*** is new; matter between brackets [~~omitted material~~] is material to be omitted.

AN ACT relating to public health; requiring certain medical facilities to report facility-acquired infections as sentinel events to the Health Division of the Department of Human Resources; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Legislative Counsel's Digest:

1 Existing law requires medical facilities to report each sentinel event to the
2 Health Division of the Department of Human Resources. (NRS 439.835) A sentinel
3 event is an unexpected occurrence involving death or serious physical or
4 psychological injury, including the loss of limb or function. (NRS 439.830) The
5 Health Division must analyze and report trends regarding sentinel events and report
6 its findings to the Repository for Health Care Quality Assurance. (NRS 439.840,
7 439.845)

8 This bill adds a facility-acquired infection to the definition of a sentinel event
9 which must be reported to the Health Division. A facility-acquired infection
10 includes surgical site infections, ventilator-associated pneumonia, central line-
11 related bloodstream infections and urinary tract infections. This bill also authorizes
12 the Administrator of the Health Division to establish additional categories of
13 facility-acquired infections.



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THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN
SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 **Section 1.** Chapter 439 of NRS is hereby amended by adding
2 thereto a new section to read as follows:

3 ***“Facility-acquired infection” means a localized or systemic
4 condition which results from an adverse reaction to the presence
5 of an infectious agent or its toxins and which was not detected as
6 present or incubating at the time a patient was admitted to a
7 medical facility, including, without limitation:***

- 8 **1. Surgical site infections;**
- 9 **2. Ventilator-associated pneumonia;**
- 10 **3. Central line-related bloodstream infections;**
- 11 **4. Urinary tract infections; and**
- 12 **5. Other categories of infections as may be established by the
13 Administrator by regulation pursuant to NRS 439.890.**

14 **Sec. 2.** NRS 439.800 is hereby amended to read as follows:
15 439.800 As used in NRS 439.800 to 439.890, inclusive, **and**
16 **section 1 of this act**, unless the context otherwise requires, the
17 words and terms defined in NRS 439.805 to 439.830, inclusive, **and**
18 **section 1 of this act** have the meanings ascribed to them in those
19 sections.

20 **Sec. 3.** NRS 439.830 is hereby amended to read as follows:
21 439.830 “Sentinel event” means an unexpected occurrence
22 involving **facility-acquired infection**, death or serious physical or
23 psychological injury or the risk thereof, including, without
24 limitation, any process variation for which a recurrence would carry
25 a significant chance of a serious adverse outcome. The term includes
26 loss of limb or function.

27 **Sec. 4.** NRS 439.860 is hereby amended to read as follows:
28 439.860 Any report, document and any other information
29 compiled or disseminated pursuant to the provisions of NRS
30 439.800 to 439.890, inclusive, **and section 1 of this act** is not
31 admissible in evidence in any administrative or legal proceeding
32 conducted in this State.

33 **Sec. 5.** NRS 439.880 is hereby amended to read as follows:
34 439.880 No person is subject to any criminal penalty or civil
35 liability for libel, slander or any similar cause of action in tort if he,
36 without malice:

- 37 1. Reports a sentinel event to a governmental entity with
38 jurisdiction or another appropriate authority;
- 39 2. Notifies a governmental entity with jurisdiction or another
40 appropriate authority of a sentinel event;



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1 3. Transmits information regarding a sentinel event to a
2 governmental entity with jurisdiction or another appropriate
3 authority;

4 4. Compiles, prepares or disseminates information regarding a
5 sentinel event to a governmental entity with jurisdiction or another
6 appropriate authority; or

7 5. Performs any other act authorized pursuant to NRS 439.800
8 to 439.890, inclusive **H, and section 1 of this act.**

9 **Sec. 6.** NRS 439.885 is hereby amended to read as follows:

10 439.885 If a medical facility:

11 1. Commits a violation of any provision of NRS 439.800 to
12 439.890, inclusive, **and section 1 of this act,** or for any violation for
13 which an administrative sanction pursuant to NRS 449.163 would
14 otherwise be applicable; and

15 2. Of its own volition, reports the violation to the
16 Administrator,

17 → such a violation must not be used as the basis for imposing an
18 administrative sanction pursuant to NRS 449.163.

19 **Sec. 7.** NRS 439.890 is hereby amended to read as follows:

20 439.890 The Administrator shall adopt such regulations as the
21 Administrator determines to be necessary or advisable to carry out
22 the provisions of NRS 439.800 to 439.890, inclusive **H, and**
23 **section 1 of this act.**
