SUMMARY—Revises provisions governing eligibility for millennium scholarship. (BDR 34-804)

AN ACT relating to education; making completion of community service a condition to eligibility for a millennium scholarship; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Legislative Counsel's Digest:

- 1 Existing law establishes millennium scholarships and the eligibility
2 requirements for receipt of such a scholarship. (NRS 396.911-396.938)
3 In addition to the other requirements for eligibility, this bill requires a student
4 to perform at least 20 hours of community service which meets certain criteria
5 established by the Board of Regents of the University of Nevada during the 2 years
6 before he applies for a millennium scholarship. This requirement will first apply to
7 students who are eligible to receive a millennium scholarship on and after July 1,
8 2008.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN
SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

- 1 **Section 1.** NRS 396.930 is hereby amended to read as follows:
2 396.930 1. Except as otherwise provided in subsections 2 and
3 3, a student may apply to the Board of Regents for a millennium
4 scholarship if he:



- 1 (a) Has been a resident of this State for at least 2 years before he
2 applies for the scholarship;
- 3 (b) Except as otherwise provided in paragraph (c), graduated
4 from a public or private high school in this State:
5 (1) After May 1, 2000, but not later than May 1, 2003; or
6 (2) After May 1, 2003, and, except as otherwise provided in
7 paragraph (c) of subsection 2, not more than 6 years before he
8 applies for the scholarship;
- 9 (c) Does not satisfy the requirements of paragraph (b) and:
10 (1) Was enrolled as a pupil in a public or private high school
11 in this State with a class of pupils who were regularly scheduled to
12 graduate after May 1, 2000;
13 (2) Received his high school diploma within 4 years after he
14 was regularly scheduled to graduate; and
15 (3) Applies for the scholarship not more than 6 years after he
16 was regularly scheduled to graduate from high school;
- 17 (d) Maintained in high school in the courses designated by the
18 Board of Regents pursuant to paragraph (b) of subsection 2, at least:
19 (1) A 3.0 grade point average on a 4.0 grading scale, if he
20 was a member of the graduating class of 2003 or 2004;
21 (2) A 3.1 grade point average on a 4.0 grading scale, if he
22 was a member of the graduating class of 2005 or 2006; or
23 (3) A 3.25 grade point average on a 4.0 grading scale, if he
24 was a member of the graduating class of 2007 or a later graduating
25 class; ~~and~~
26 (e) *Submits an application on or after July 1, 2008, he has
27 performed at least 20 hours of community service for this State, a
28 political subdivision of this State or a charitable organization that
29 provides services to a community or the residents of a community
30 in this State during the 2 years before he applies for the
31 scholarship; and*
32 (f) Is enrolled in at least:
33 (1) Six semester credit hours in a community college within
34 the System; or
35 (2) Twelve semester credit hours in another eligible
36 institution.
- 37 2. The Board of Regents:
38 (a) Shall define the core curriculum that a student must complete
39 in high school to be eligible for a millennium scholarship.
40 (b) Shall designate the courses in which a student must earn the
41 minimum grade point averages set forth in paragraph (d) of
42 subsection 1.
43 (c) *Shall establish criteria for the performance of community
44 service required by paragraph (e) of subsection 1.*

1 (d) May establish criteria with respect to students who have
2 been on active duty serving in the Armed Forces of the United
3 States to exempt such [student] **students** from the 6-year limitation
4 on applications that is set forth in subparagraph (2) of paragraph (b)
5 of subsection 1.

6 3. Except as otherwise provided in paragraph (c) of subsection
7 1, for students who did not graduate from a public or private high
8 school in this State and who have been residents of this State for at
9 least 2 years, the Board of Regents shall establish:

10 (a) The minimum score on a standardized test that such students
11 must receive; or

12 (b) Other criteria that students must meet,
13 ➔ to be eligible for millennium scholarships.

14 4. In awarding scholarships, the Board of Regents shall
15 enhance its outreach to students who:

16 (a) Are pursuing a career in education or health care;

17 (b) Come from families who lack sufficient financial resources
18 to pay for the costs of sending their children to an eligible
19 institution; or

20 (c) Substantially participated in an antismoking, antidrug or
21 antialcohol program during high school.

22 **Sec. 2.** The Board of Regents of the University of Nevada
23 shall adopt the criteria required by paragraph (c) of subsection 2 of
24 section 1 of this act on or before January 1, 2006. The Board of
25 Regents shall ensure that the school districts in this State are
26 provided with adequate notice of the criteria and otherwise provide
27 for public dissemination of the criteria.

28 **Sec. 3.** This act becomes effective on July 1, 2005.
