Counsel's Digest will be changed to read as follows:**

Legislative Counsel's Digest:

Existing law requires the board of county commissioners of each county to appoint three or five members to the county advisory board to manage wildlife. (NRS 501.260)

This bill changes the number of potential appointees from three or five to five or seven in any county whose population is 400,000 or more (currently Clark County).
