Legislative Counsel's Digest:

Existing law prohibits the Department of Motor Vehicles from issuing a driver's license to any person if the Director of the Department has good cause to believe that, by physical or mental disability, the person would not be able to operate a motor vehicle safely. (NRS 483.250) Existing law authorizes the Department to require an applicant for the initial issuance or renewal of a driver's license to submit to certain examinations to determine the applicant's ability to safely operate a motor vehicle. (NRS 483.330, 483.386)

This bill authorizes a person who is 18 years of age or older to file with the Department of Motor Vehicles a report requesting that the Department examine the person's spouse or close relative to determine the ability of the spouse or relative to safely operate a motor vehicle. The Department may, after the examinations used to determine the ability of a person to safely operate a motor vehicle, allow the spouse or relative to retain the license, or may suspend, revoke or restrict the license.
