A.B. No. 416—Revises provisions governing Advisory Board on Automotive Affairs.

## If this amendment is adopted, the Legislative

## Counsel's Digest will be changed to read as follows:

## **Legislative Counsel's Digest:**

Existing law creates the Advisory Board on Automotive Affairs within the Division of Insurance of the Department of Business and Industry, consisting of seven members appointed by the Governor, and establishes the qualifications and duties of those members. Under existing law, the Board is required to review, and is authorized to propose, regulations on certain specified issues or issues that otherwise relate to the operation of body shops or automobile wreckers. (NRS 487.002)

This bill transfers the Advisory Board on Automotive Affairs from the Division of Insurance of the Department of Business and Industry to the Department of Motor Vehicles. This bill also revises the qualifications and duties of the members of the Board. Those duties include studying the regulation of garagemen, automobile wreckers and operators of body shops and salvage pools, analyzing and advising the Department regarding certain consumer complaints, recommending necessary regulations and proposed legislation and preparing a biennial report of its activities and recommendations for submission to the Governor and the Legislature.
