Legislative Counsel's Digest:

Existing law establishes the requirements for occupational education in public schools within the State. (NRS 388.380)

This bill redesignates occupational education as career and technical education. This bill requires the Board to prescribe a program of career and technical education for pupils enrolled in grades 9 through 12. This bill authorizes school districts and charter schools to establish and maintain a program of career and technical education in accordance with the Board's program.

This bill appropriates \$12 million over the next 2 fiscal years to the Department of Education for allocations to school districts and charter schools to provide a program of career and technical education. A school district or charter school must submit an application for an allocation. The amount of an allocation to a school district or charter school whose application is approved must be based on the estimated number of pupils who will participate in the program for that fiscal year and the financial need of the school district or charter school.
